What Is Catechesis? - Pastor Sorenson

As a new school year approaches, so too does a new year of Sunday School and youth catechesis. You know what Sunday School is and how important it is for the youngest among us to attend Sunday School. Not only do our youth benefit themselves from hearing more of God's Word (even stories they have heard many times before), but Sunday School is also a wonderful time for the youth in the congregation to grow together. They spend time in the Word together. They do activities together. They share their knowledge with each other. They experience the oneness of the communion of the saints, the Church, together. So, truly, you know what Sunday School is and what a treasure it is for us to have this at our church.

But what is youth catechesis (pronounced cat-uh-key-sis)? Well, you already know what it is, but you probably know it by a different name: confirmation. Youth catechesis is another way of speaking about confirmation classes, but before you dismiss this new terminology, consider why this change of speech is so important.

Let us start by addressing the word confirmation. This is truly a good word as it reminds us that we are "confirming" (that is "establishing the truth of") our adoption by God's grace in Holy Baptism. As such, the word confirmation applies properly to the Rite of Confirmation which comes after a period of instruction. During this Rite, those who have been instructed in the faith confirm all that God has done for them and that they truly are a child of God. As such, it is good to use the word "confirmation" when we are speaking of the actually Rite that takes place within the Divine Service.

But what about the period of instruction which leads up to the Rite? This is where the terminology "catechesis" comes in. Catechesis is derived from two Greek words which, roughly, mean "to sound back" or "to echo back." These are the same words which form the basis for the word "catechism."

Catechesis, then, is a time when those who are being instructed "sound back" or "echo back" the things they are learning. They hear the Word of God and they echo it back. They learn the Ten Commandments, the Creed, the Lord's Prayer and they learn how to sound back both the content and the meaning of each of these. They are instructed about the Sacrament of Holy Baptism, Confession and Absolution, and the Sacrament of the Altar and they echo back the wonders of God's grace given to them in each of these ways.

This period of instruction is truly all about echoing back the truth that God has revealed to us in His Word. It is a time for those being instructed to grow in the knowledge of this truth, but also to have their voices be tuned to speak this truth in a world that so desperately needs to hear it. It is a time for them to read, mark, learn, and inwardly digest the basic tenets of the faith in order that they may continue to grow in this faith.

As such, it is most fitting to apply the term "catechesis" to this period of instruction. For this term reminds us of what is happening during this period, but it also reminds us that we do not graduate from learning the faith once we "confirm" our faith. Instead, our whole lives as Christians is continually echoing back the truth of God's Word and to sound forth to all the world that Jesus Christ has saved us by His death and His resurrection.
