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Do I Need Lent?

"If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. But if we confess our sins, God, who is faithful and just, will forgive our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness" (1 John 1:8-9). You'll hear and speak these words every Sunday during the season of Lent this year. They are spoken as part of the exhortation to confession. The words themselves drive us to confess our sins and repent that we have been unrighteous in thought, word, and deed. Not much else needs to be said about them, as they are quite clear. We are sinners and to say otherwise would only be to deceive ourselves and to cast the truth away from us.

As clear as these words are, however, do we really believe them? Do we really believe we are sinners and that sin is as horrific and destructive as Scripture tells us it is? Or do we just believe that we do some bad stuff, but it's not really a big deal in the end since God will forgive it anyway? All too often, we fall into that last camp. We think sin is something we hear about in church, but not something which affects our everyday lives.

This is where the season of Lent comes in. While the entire life of a Christian is a life of repentance, the season of Lent highlights this more than any other time in the Church Year. The signs of our repentance, (which means turning away from sin and back to God), are everywhere. We fast from saying the joyous word "alleluia" during this time. We fast from seeing the glory of Christ's cross during this time. We fast from the joyous colors of the paraments during this time. We may even fast from different things of this world during this time, preferring instead to come to church on Wednesday nights or to do daily devotions with our family.

All of this fasting is done to remind us how serious and dangerous and deadly sin really is. In a time when personal comfort reigns as king, the season of Lent reminds us that the Christian is never truly comfortable in this sinful world. The Christian is always under attack from the devil. The Christian is always harassed by the world. The Christian is always burdened with the effects of sin.

If your life as a Christian is a comfortable one, then, repent! Turn back from your sinful ways, because, if your life as a Christian is comfortable in this world, then you have deceived yourself and the truth is not in you. For a life of sin is never comfortable for one who has been washed clean in Christ. A life of sin is never comfortable for one who God has forgiven and made righteous through the blood of Christ. A life of sin is never comfortable for one who knows the awful price that Christ paid to save you from your sin.

This is ultimately what Lent is all about. It's about being brought to repentance. It's about recognizing our need for a Savior and what that Savior had to endure to save us. It's about being uncomfortable in this world so we may long for the comfort of the new creation. It's about preparing to descend into the depths of woe on Good Friday in order that we may ascend to the great heights of joy on Easter Sunday. It's about confessing that we are sinners in order that God may absolve us and make us righteous in Christ. Do we need this? Do we need Lent? The answer is a most definite yes! For Lent brings us low so that in Christ and His resurrection we may be raised up again to everlasting life. And that is something we most desperately need.


