and I look for the resurrection of the dead and the life + of the world to come. Amen.








Proper Preface (Full)





 Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 556 Dear Christians, One and All, Rejoice Pray the Collect of the Day: O God, the giver of all that is good, by Your holy inspiration grant that we may think those things that are right and by Your merciful guiding accomplish them; through Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.
- Tues. 5/19: Read the Epistle lesson: 1 Peter 3:13-22 Continue to bear witness to Christ no matter what suffering may come, for Christ has suffered to save you and He gives this salvation to you in Holy Baptism.

- Sat. 5/23: Read the Gospel lesson: John 17:1-11 Even as Christ prepares to ascend back to the Father, He prays for us because we are His and He gives us eternal life.
