


Proper Preface

Below you will find a model you can use for your personal or family devotions that focuses you on the readings from the previous Sunday, while also preparing you for what you will hear the following Sunday. - Mon. 8/3: Read the Old Testament lesson: Isaiah 55:1-5 – Come, eat and drink the Lord’s free bread and wine by which He gives you His steadfast love and glorifies you.
