- Mon. 8/10: Read the Old Testament lesson: Job 38:4-18 – It is God who has created all things and He alone has dominion over them all. Do not fear, therefore, because all things are subject to God.
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 717 – Eternal Father, Strong to Save
Pray the Collect of the Day: Almighty and most merciful God, preserve us from all harm and danger that we, being ready in both body and soul, may cheerfully accomplish what You want done; through Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.
- Tues. 8/11: Read the Epistle lesson: Romans 10:5-17 – Hearing the word of Christ, faith is created in us which confesses Jesus as Lord and causes our heart to believe that God raised Him from the dead.

Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 8/10)
- Wed 8/12: Read the Gospel lesson: Matthew 14:22-33 – As Jesus treads treacherous waters under His feet, He takes away our fear by saving us from certain death.
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 717 – Eternal Father, Strong to Save
Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 8/10)
- Thur. 8/13: Read the Old Testament lesson: Isaiah 56:1, 6-8 – The Lord is just and righteous as He gathers all people, Israelites and foreigners alike, to His holy mountain.
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 653 – In Christ There Is No East or West
Pray the Collect of the Day: Almighty and everlasting Father, You give Your children many blessings even though we are undeserving. In every trial and temptation grant us steadfast confidence in Your loving-kindness and mercy; through Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.
- Fri. 8/14: Read the Epistle lesson: Romans 11:1-2a, 13-15, 28-32 – Salvation belongs to all who are called by God. For all have disobeyed Him, but Christ has come so He may have mercy on us all, regardless of nationality.
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 653 – In Christ There Is No East or West
Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 8/13)
- Sat. 8/15: Read the Gospel lesson: Matthew 15:21-28 – Jesus has come to save the lost sheep of this world who have faith in Him, looking to Him for all good things.
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 653 – In Christ There Is No East or West
Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 8/13)
