# The Great Confession of Christian Burial

When it comes to caring for the body after death, many people have one question on their mind: how much is it going to cost? Whether it is planning for the care of your own body or for the body of a loved one, money inevitably seems to be the driving force in the decision making. Few people stop to think, not about money, but about the confession they are making in how the body is treated after death. Instead of pondering the confession being made with a burial, people ponder how they can cut a few dollars off the bottom line.

Before going any further, two things must be made clear. First, this discussion is not to suggest that money is no object and should be ignored. The cost should be considered and the Christian should make wise decisions in regards to money for a funeral. Second, this discussion is not to condemn cremation or those who have chosen or may choose cremation. The cremated body will be resurrected just as sure as the buried body will be resurrected.

Yet, with these things in mind, consider the great confession of Christian burial. First, by burial, the Christian confesses creation. God created your body, just as He created Adam and Eve who bore the image of God. By burying the body, instead of cremating it or leaving it in the open, the Christian confesses that this body was no accident. It was formed in the womb by the Creator Himself.

Secondly, the burial of the body points to the Incarnation of Christ. Jesus came to this earth and took on flesh. He has a physical body, like your body. He is not some other form or creature. He has a human body which, when He died, was buried. By burying the body, the Christian confesses this Incarnation of Christ. God bore your flesh and saw it fit to be buried in the tomb. Your burial, then, confesses belief in the Incarnation.

Finally, the Christian buries the body as a confession of the resurrection of the dead. The body is put into the ground because it will rise from that ground again when Christ returns. What better confession can there be of the resurrection than burial? You are not done with your body. You do not discard it or dismember it because you will spend eternity in that very body which now sleeps in the grave. It will be a glorified, perfected body, but it will be the same body nonetheless.

Burial, then, presents a bold confession against the various other religions and heresies in this world. The Evolutionist sees no need to bury the body because it is simply the result of evolution, not creation. A Muslim does bury his body, but he does it while denying the Incarnation. A Gnostic would never bury his body, because he believes that salvation is the soul finally escaping the body and discarding it forever. Pious Jews, like the Sadducees, would never bury their bodies, because they believe there is no resurrection of the body. Eastern religions, like Hinduism, would never bury bodies, because they believe in reincarnation, not resurrection.

In the midst of all of these other confessions, consider the confession which a Christian burial makes. The very body which God created, the very flesh which God took upon Himself in Christ, sleeps in the grave awaiting the day of resurrection. Death has no hold on your body because Christ has already burst the bonds of your grave. What a wonderful confession!

The Book of the Month will be available in the Parish Hall library for you to look through and read. You may take the book home to read as well, but we ask that you please do not hold onto it for too long so other people can enjoy it as well. The September Book of the Month is *Faith in the Shadow of a Pandemic* by John T. Pless and Jacob Corzine. Here is an excerpt from the book: "This pandemic has prompted us to become reacquainted with Luther's letter to Pastor Johann Hess during a time of plague in 1527. Things were bad in Wittenberg when Luther wrote that letter. Luther referred to his own house as a hospital, as he and Katie were caring for Karlstadt's gravely ill sister-in-law (Karlstadt was Luther's continuous colleague and would-be reformer). Katie was pregnant with Elizabeth, and their son Hans was seriously ill. These were uncertain and strange days for Luther and his colleagues, no doubt. No wonder that after the epidemic was past, Luther would describe his situation as hanging on to Christ by a thread even as Satan had bound his ankles with chains and was pulling him into hell. But faith will not let go of Christ."
