# **Martin Luther's Church**

We here at St. Peter Evangelical Lutheran Church are part of Martin Luther's church. We can trace our theological roots back to Luther and the other faithful reformers. We even still use many of Luther's writings and sermons to teach the faith. Everyone in the Lutheran church knows and respects the name Martin Luther.

This has led many outside of the Lutheran church to contend that we Lutherans rely heavily, if not solely, on Martin Luther for what we believe. They will say that our faith started on October 31, 1517 when Luther began the Reformation by nailing the 95 Theses to the church doors in Wittenberg. If something is in question among us, they reason, we turn first to Martin Luther to answer the question, not the Bible or other fathers of the church. After all, Luther is the father of our church and the one who began our denomination, they think.

All of this, however, is simply not true. We bear the name "Lutheran" not because we worship Martin Luther or defer to him in all things, but because he, along with the other reformers, preached Christ and Him crucified.

On the one hand, calling ourselves "Lutheran" is a way of saying just as Luther believed in Christ, so too we believe in Christ. On the other hand, calling ourselves "Lutheran" is a way to honor a man who preached the Gospel at a time when it was being trampled by those who proclaimed salvation through the Law and to give thanks to God for preserving His church through the work of His saints.

In this way, we do indeed still read what Luther wrote just like we read what all of the saints before us have written. For it's not the man who wrote it that is our concern, but how and what the man wrote about Christ and the Scriptures.

Thus, while we read the writings of the church fathers, our only rule and norm, the only thing we rely on to show us what is true, is the Bible. All of what we teach comes from the Bible alone, not from Luther. Where Luther is in agreement with Scripture, we gladly read and learn. Where he is not, we hold to Scripture, not Luther.

Understanding this, then, shows us that our faith does not begin with Luther. It begins with Christ. While the term "Lutheran" shows up first in the 1500s, the faith of the Lutherans shows up first in the Garden of Eden. For just like Adam and Eve, who believed that a Messiah would come to save them from their sins, so too do we believe in the Messiah who came to crush the head of the serpent and save us from our sins.

The Lutheran faith isn't something new. Instead, it's a continuation of the faith God first gave to Adam and Eve, continued to give to the saints in the Old Testament, and even now still creates within us.

As we come up on another celebration of the Reformation this month, we must always remember this. Truly, we give thanks to God for Martin Luther and the rest of the reformers who preached the Gospel at a time when many had never heard it. We recognize that God raised up Luther, as He has done with so many other saints throughout the ages, to defend and fight for the truth of the Gospel in a time when it was under severe attack. And we bear the name "Lutheran" and gladly confess that we are part of Martin Luther's church because we realize that Martin Luther's church is really none other than Jesus Christ's Church. For Luther may be one small brick in this Church, but Jesus Christ is the rock-solid foundation. To Christ alone be the glory forever and ever! Amen.
