The 12 Days of Christmas

There is a common misconception in the world that the twelve days of Christmas begin on December 13th, twelve days before Christmas. This is, in fact, not true. The twelve days of Christmas actually begin on Christmas itself, December 25th, and they end on January 5th. Thus, the twelve days of Christmas make up the liturgical season of Christmas.

For the world, this does not make sense. After all, Christmas begins for many people as soon as the turkey is off the table on Thanksgiving (if they can even wait that long!). The whole month of December, then, is filled with Christmas music and decorations, shopping and Christmas cards, and everything else that has come to be associated with Christmas.

The unfortunate side effect of this is that many people are ready to be done with Christmas as soon as the presents are opened. Instead of patiently waiting and preparing for the celebration of Christmas, as the season of Advent pushes us to do, many people will rush the celebration. Since they could not wait to celebrate, they arrive to Christmas day thankful that Christmas is finally over. They hurry up with their traditions in the morning to check the last item off the list, not even making time to worship the Lord in His house on the day of His birth. What a sad situation this becomes!

This is why it is all the more important for us in the Church to remember that Christmas begins, not when the radio stations turn on Christmas music, but once we have gone through the full season of Advent, waiting and preparing for the birth of our Savior. Christmas begins on that morning when we gather around the Lord's table to receive the body and blood of our Lord who took on that very human flesh in order to save us.

As we do this, we arrive to Christmas morning ready to burst forth in joy. Our hearts and minds are turned away from the idols of this world and back to our God who became man and dwelt among us. Our patience is rewarded as our faith grabs hold once again of the Christ Child and the wonder that is His incarnation.

But our joy doesn't stop there. Instead, the season of Christmas follows. For eleven more days, we continue to marvel and rejoice that our God broke into this creation in order to save us and give us the gift of the resurrection. While the world puts the decorations away and moves onto the next holiday, the Church lets the beauty of Christ's incarnation continue to shine and lets the message of the angels ring out even louder, "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace among those with whom he is pleased!" (Luke 2:14)

After all, it would be silly to fill ourselves up in the hours leading up to a big feast. Instead, we come to a feast hungry so we may be filled with the wonderful food on the table. For this same reason, let us not fill ourselves up on Christmas before Christmas has arrived. Instead, let us arrive to Christmas starving for it, prepared and ready to celebrate on December 25th.

For our celebration will not end on December 25th. Rather, it will continue on for a full twelve days, with each and every one of them bringing us the joy and peace which are ours because our Lord took on flesh to dwell among us and, ultimately, to suffer, die, and rise again so that we too may live.
