Psalm 150, the final psalm in the book, begins this way: "Praise the Lord! Praise God in his sanctuary; praise him in his mighty heavens! Praise him for his mighty deeds; praise him according to his excellent greatness!" (Psalm 150:1-2)

Library:

The Book of the Month will be available in the Parish Hall library for you to look through and read. You may take the book home to read as well, but we ask that you please do not hold onto it for too long so other people can enjoy it as well. The February Book of the Month is *Connected to Christ: Why Membership Matters* by Peter Speckhard. Here is an excerpt from the book: "Christians are by definition members of the Church, which is the people of God. We are baptized into a people, a kingdom, a body, a huge global family of Christians. To be a Christian is to be a member of a larger group. There is no such thing as Christianity that is simply one-on-one, you and Jesus, independent of other believers. You have a relationship with Jesus, of course, and in a sense, it is an extremely personal relationship — you know Him and He knows you. But that word personal, while true, is not exactly biblical and leaves out so much of what God gives us and how He forms us with the Gospel. Essentially, Christianity is corporate."
