Holy Week Is Inconvenient

Holy Week is inconvenient. The idea of coming to church on Palm Sunday and then again on Thursday and Friday and Saturday seems overwhelming. Not to mention, it seriously changes how the flow of your week will go.

Maybe in order to get to church on Thursday and Friday you have to come straight from work. Maybe you wouldn't be able to have dinner before you come. Maybe those times are when you just need to sit down, take a deep breath, and relax after a long day. Maybe there's any number of other reasons why Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter Vigil are simply inconvenient days and times for you to come to church.

Good. Holy Week should be inconvenient. It should be a week which alters your weekly routine. It should stand out as a different week from the other 51 weeks of the year. It should be a week where you're uncomfortable and having to shuffle things around in order to be at church. It should be a time where you make absolutely every effort to be at church for each service, Thursday, Friday, and Saturday, letting no other excuses keep you away.

For in this week, you come face to face with sin, death, and salvation like no other week in the year. On Palm Sunday, you see a picture of Christ in triumph even as He comes humbly to lay down His life on the cross.

On Maundy Thursday, you hear of Christ's betrayal at the hands of one of His disciples before you see the altar stripped bare, giving you a vivid picture of the humiliation Christ suffers because of your sins.

On Good Friday, you sit in darkness as you contemplate in full measure Christ's suffering and death on the cross all for your salvation, seeing what a great Savior you have.

At the Easter Vigil, you hear the complete story of salvation, from the fall into sin until the present day, before ending with the triumphant proclamation of Christ's resurrection.

These really are important services for every Christian to attend. Without these, you go from the triumph of Palm Sunday to the triumph of Easter without ever really confronting your sin and what your sin has done. Without these, Easter becomes just one more high point in a world with no valleys. Without these, you don't really delve into the depth of your sin, which means you also don't really understand the depth of Christ's salvation. Your sin becomes small and so too your Savior becomes small.

This world does its best to convince you that comfort and convenience are king. But Holy Week snaps you back to reality. This world does its best to convince you that sin is no big deal. But Holy Week forces you to see the truth of what sin is and what sin does. This world does its best to convince you that you can have Easter joy without Holy Week suffering. But Holy Week teaches you that true Easter joy is only known when you've walked with Christ through suffering into death and back to life again.

Count it as joy, then, to be inconvenienced for a week. So what if dinner has to wait a little bit longer? So what if you have to come to church straight from work? So what if Holy Week is inconvenient? Because that inconvenience is nothing compared to the great gifts which Christ is giving you during that week. That inconvenience is nothing compared to the joy that Holy Week prepares you for on Easter morning. That inconvenience is nothing compared to the strength you receive from hearing God's Word and receiving His Sacrament with your brothers and sisters in Christ during that most Holy Week.

The solution to our problems is found in what we receive from God Himself, in His appraisal of us, and in His gifts to us. Our piety is all a matter of receiving grace upon grace from the fullness of God the Father."

Easter Egg Hunt: The Easter Egg Hunt will be on Saturday, April 3 at 10:00 AM. We will meet in the shelter house (weather permitting) to allow for better spacing. Eggs will be available in the narthex to pick up and fill with individually wrapped candy. Please have the eggs returned by April 1. Also, be sure to invite any children or grandchildren to be part of the hunt on April 3.

Easter Breakfast: The Youth Group will serve an Easter breakfast this year between the sunrise and Divine Service on Easter (April 4). We will plan on serving the breakfast from about 7:15-8:40 AM.

Lord's Supper on Easter: Please take note that this year the Lord's Supper will be offered at <u>both</u> the 6:30 AM Sunrise service and the 9:00 AM service.

Easter Sunday: If you have family coming on Easter Sunday, please feel free to sit together in consecutive pews, moving the dividers as needed. This will allow for maximum capacity while also maintaining proper distancing. Likewise, if the church is starting to fill, consider sitting with someone else <u>if and only if you and they are comfortable sitting together.</u> We want to ensure that everyone who wishes to attend on Easter will be able to while also allowing everyone to be spaced apart as they desire.
