Lord's Supper on Easter: Please take note that this morning the Lord's Supper will be offered at both the 6:30 AM Sunrise service and the 9:00 AM service this morning.

Easter Breakfast: The Youth Group will serve an Easter breakfast this morning between the sunrise and Divine Service on Easter (April 4). We will plan on serving the breakfast from about 7:15-8:40 AM.

Easter Sunday Seating: If you have family coming this morning, please feel free to sit together in consecutive pews, moving the dividers as needed. This will allow for maximum capacity while also maintaining proper distancing. Likewise, if the church is starting to fill, consider sitting with someone else if and only if you and they are comfortable sitting together. We want to ensure that everyone who wishes to attend will be able to while also allowing everyone to be spaced apart as they desire.

Quarterly Voters' Meeting: Our next quarterly voters' meeting is scheduled for Sunday, April 11th, immediately following the worship service.

Below you will find a model you can use for your personal or family devotions that focuses you on the readings from the previous Sunday, while also preparing you for what you will hear the following Sunday. In modeling your devotions this way, you and your family can stay united to the church year and reinforce what you hear, sing, and pray every Sunday.

- Mon. 4/5: Read the Old Testament lesson: Isaiah 25:6-9 – By the resurrection of Christ, God has swallowed up death forever and forgiven us all of our sins. We rejoice in this because it is our salvation.
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 458 – Christ Jesus Lay in Death’s Strong Bands
Pray the Collect of the Day: Almighty God the Father, through Your only-begotten Son, Jesus Christ, You have overcome death and opened the gate of everlasting life to us. Grant that we, who celebrate with joy the day of our Lord’s resurrection, may be raised from the death of sin by Your life-giving Spirit; through Jesus Christ, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.
- Tues. 4/6: Read the Epistle lesson: 1 Corinthians 15:1-11 – This is the Gospel which saves us: that Christ died, was buried, and was raised again from the dead.
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 458 – Christ Jesus Lay in Death’s Strong Bands
Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 4/5)
- Wed. 4/7: Read the Gospel lesson: Mark 16:1-8 – The crucified One is no longer in the tomb, but risen for our life, salvation, and resurrection!
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 458 – Christ Jesus Lay in Death’s Strong Bands
Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 4/5)
- Thur. 4/8: Read the first lesson: Acts 4:32-35 – As we live in the light of Christ’s resurrection, we are free to share everything with our neighbors because we know we have all we need in the crucified and risen Lord Jesus.
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 470 – O Sons and Daughters of the King
Pray the Collect of the Day: Almighty God, grant that we who have celebrated the Lord’s resurrection may by Your grace confess in our life and conversation that Jesus is Lord and God; through the same Jesus Christ, Your Son, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.
- Fri. 4/9: Read the Epistle lesson: 1 John 1:1-2:2 – Though we live in a world of darkness and still sin, Jesus advocates for us before the Father and brings us forgiveness through His blood and resurrection.
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 470 – O Sons and Daughters of the King
Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 4/8)
- Sat. 4/10: Read the Gospel lesson: John 20:19-31 – The Scriptures are written so we may share in the faith of Thomas who confessed that Jesus is Lord and God. This faith is given to us through Christ’s servants in the Office of the Holy Ministry who preach the Word and forgive our sins in the stead and by the command of Jesus.
