Ascension Day: What's the Big Deal?

In recent memory, Ascension Day has become a bit of an afterthought in most churches. Many churches barely even acknowledge the day, let alone celebrate it. Those who do celebrate Christ's Ascension usually do so on a Sunday, 3 days after the actual Ascension.

None of this is wrong, of course. But it does sell the Ascension a bit short. It can make us think that Christ's Ascension isn't that big of a deal. It can make us believe that Christ's Ascension doesn't really mean anything to us. It can make us regard Christ's Ascension as nothing more than a minor festival, if we even regard it that highly.

May it not be! For Christ's Ascension really is a big deal and it's something that should bring us great joy and comfort. That is, if we realize what the Ascension is actually doing for us.

Often times people think of the Ascension simply as Jesus leaving earth. He ascends into heaven, thus leaving us behind until He comes again. He enjoys the bliss of heaven, sitting at the Father's right hand, and being surrounded by the angels and those who have fallen asleep in the faith.

But that is only part of the story. For the Ascension didn't take Jesus away from us. Instead, the Ascension brought heaven near to us. Since Christ has ascended into heaven, He now lives and reigns where time and space don't hem Him in. This is why He says in the last chapter of Matthew, "Behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age" (Matthew 28:20b)

Because of this, because Jesus is no longer bound by time and space, Jesus is with us always. Whenever His Word is spoken, there He is. Whenever someone is baptized, there He is. Whenever you receive the Lord's Supper, there He is. Whenever the Church is gathered together by the work of the Holy Spirit, there Christ is. There heaven and earth meet.

Christ's Ascension guarantees all of this. It guarantees that He will surely be present with us in each of these ways. No matter where we are in this world, no matter when we gather together. For heaven isn't some place up in the sky far away from us. Heaven is wherever God is.

And since Christ has ascended into heaven in His real, human body, we can be sure that we encounter heaven even in and with our real, human bodies. Our ears encounter heaven because they hear Christ's Word. Our mouths encounter heaven because they eat and drink Christ's body and blood. Our whole body encounters heaven because Christ comes to us as we gather together as His body, the Church.

This is why Ascension Day is such a big deal. Because without it, we would have no such guarantees. Without it, we would never encounter heaven on earth. But with it, we are confident that our great High Priest, Christ Jesus, comes to us. With it, we know that heaven and earth meet together as we join together in worship to be served by Christ and to receive all of His gifts.

With all of this mind, I invite all of you to come to church on Thursday, May 13th at 7:00 PM as we celebrate Christ's Ascension. We will be joined that night with our brothers and sisters from St. John, White Creek and St. Paul, Jonesville, as a reminder of our unity in Christ and as an opportunity to be strengthened and encouraged by our fellow saints. And most importantly of all, we will all join together because we know that that night heaven will come to earth and we will be with our Lord Jesus who is indeed with us always, even to the end of the age.

CHURCH HISTORY

In preparation for our 150th anniversary celebration, some church members are looking through historical church documents. Barb Minor has complied a list of interesting excerpts from old board meeting minutes. Some of these excerpts will be included each week in our bulletins and compiled in our monthly newsletters leading up to the celebration in July. These excerpts are from Board Minutes from April 2, 1871 to October 6, 1912 and were written in German and translated by Rev. A. A. Mueller. It is worth noting how important church attendance and voter meeting attendance was and that being in church and living a life according to God's Word was extremely important. Christian life was to be lived every day.

April 7, 1872: Resolved that each congregation member who does not work on the congregation's land pay 70¢ per day. **July 5, 1874:** There was a discussion of the fact that several members do not all fulfill their congregational duties, also do not attend the meetings and explain themselves in these meetings. It was resolved to summon the respective members in writing to justify themselves in the congregational meeting of October 5.

The May Book of the Month is *Built on the Rock: The Healthy Congregation* by Ted Kober. The emphasis will be on commitment to being in God's Word, which is the first focal point of the book. Church members and leaders mature in their faith as they practice confession and forgiveness."
