150 Years: Make a Joyful Noise!

"Make a joyful noise to the Lord, all the earth." That's how Psalm 100 begins. The entire psalm is our theme for this special 150th anniversary celebration and it is an excellent psalm for such a celebration and a remembrance.

It begins with this exhortation to make a joyful noise. Certainly, we will be making a joyful noise on July 11th, but this verse also reminds us of what has been happening here at St. Peter Evangelical Lutheran Church for the last 150 years. Ever since this congregation came into existence, the saints who have come together to worship the Lord have been making a joyful noise, singing praises to God who comes to them with all of His gifts.

"Serve the Lord with gladness! Come into His presence with singing!" Verse 2 further captures the life of the Church. For 150 years this congregation has served the Lord by gladly coming into His presence just as He has invited us.

"Know that the Lord, He is God! It is He who made us, and we are His; we are His people, and the sheep of His pasture." Verse 3 moves us into doctrine, which is to say our shared beliefs as they come from Holy Scripture. Our life together is all about knowing God to be our Lord and Creator. Not only has He made each and every one of us, but He has also made this congregation, making it a green pasture for all God's sheep throughout the ages who find here the true knowledge and teaching of who God is.

"Enter His gates with thanksgiving, and His courts with praise! Give thanks to Him; bless His name!" Here again, verse 4 shows us what the Church is. The Church is the body of Christ who gathers together within His courts to give Him thanks and to call upon His name. While many different things have happened in this place for 150 years, this one alone is central. This congregation has always and will always revolve around gathering together before the Lord within His courts.

"For the Lord is good; His steadfast love endures forever, and His faithfulness to all generations." Verse 5 brings the psalm to a close with a wonderful reminder and a promise. As we look back on the history of this congregation, we see in abundance the goodness of the Lord. There have certainly been periods of trial and hardship, but through it all the Lord has guarded and kept this congregation.

As He has in the past, so too do we know that He will in the present and in the future. Why? Because His steadfast loves endures forever and His faithfulness to all generations. This is where our anniversary celebration hits a high note. For we are not simply remembering the past or trying to relive the golden days of old, but we are rejoicing in the promises of God to continue to show us His love and faithfulness for generations to come after us.

Psalm 100, then, is quite a fitting psalm for our 150th anniversary celebration. As we join together on July 11th, we will hear these words once more, making a joyful noise while being surrounded by our brothers and sisters in Christ who all have received God's love and faithfulness in this very place.

For indeed, an anniversary celebration is not really about what we have done or even what this congregation has done, but rather about what God has done, is doing, and will do. After all, He has made us. He's provided the courts for us to gather. He's shown us His goodness and love through the gifts of Christ. For all of this, then, let us make a joyful noise for all the world to hear! To God, the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, alone be the glory now and into the ages of ages. Amen!



CHURCH HISTORY

In preparation for our 150th anniversary celebration, some church members are looking through historical church documents. Barb Minor has complied a list of interesting excerpts from old board meeting minutes. Some of these excerpts will be included each week in our bulletins and compiled in our monthly newsletters leading up to the celebration in July. These excerpts are from Board Minutes from April 2, 1871 to October 6, 1912 and were written in German and translated by Rev. A. A. Mueller. It is worth noting how important church attendance and voter meeting attendance was and that being in church and living a life according to God's Word was extremely important. Christian life was to be lived every day.

January 6, 1878: It was resolved that the pastor shall have an increase of \$30.00 in his salary. It was further resolved that those members who have children in the school and are not paying the designated school money (\$2.00) are to work two days for one child each year for the pastor.

June 30, 1878: Now followed a discussion of the fact that several parents send their children to school so irregularly. Some children have been in school only 50 or 60 days. If this continues in this way, what will become of these children" If would be impossible for them to come to a proper Christian understanding. In such a sad situation they would later be in great danger of becoming a prey either to sin or to the unbelieving world. Here in this country where there are so many sects and fanatics, it is much more necessary that they are thoroughly grounded in God's Word as in Germany. If all the children would acquire only the most necessary knowledge of the Word of God, there would be great danger that the congregation would be swept apart like chaff by the smallest storm that would strike it. We, therefore, owe it to the children and to the entire congregation to see to it that the children are firmly grounded in the Word of God. But this can be achieved only if the children attend the school regularly.

The following resolution was therefore adopted: Each child from the age of 7 to 14 shall attend the parochial school. In the last 4, that is from age 10 to 14. Each child must attend the school at least 100 days in each year. And if a child did not attend school for 100 days in each year of the last 4 years, then it should not be confirmed at the age of 14.

September 22, 1878: The meeting was opened with prayer. Then the admonition of Mr. --- took place. He, together with his wife, who had separated herself from him, had been summoned before the congregation. The woman had not appeared. She had already earlier stated that she would not come, saying it is no concern of the congregation or of the pastor when there are quarrels between marriage partners, etc. She had expressed herself before the pastor in an ungodly manner. And by the fact that she did not appear before the congregation, she has thereby excommunicated herself from the congregation. Mr. --- was then reproached with his sin, namely that he was living in disharmony with his wife and that he even mistreated her, also that he hardly ever comes to church on Sunday. He promised to do better and to make an attempt to be reconciled with his wife and to persuade her to return.

October 10, 1880: Since the old church is too large and therefore too cold for school purposes in winter, the school room is to be partitioned by a board wall. Flooring boards are to be used for this purpose.

Since it is not decent to dirty the church with tobacco juice, it is not permitted to use tobacco in the church during services or in congregational meetings.

It was further resolved to beautify the church grounds by planting trees. Accordingly, each member is to plant 2 or more maple trees on a certain day either at the end of this month or the beginning of next month.

It was also resolved that all hard bricks that are left over from the building of the church be brought up to the parsonage so that they may be used, as soon as feasible, for a necessary cistern.

January 2, 1881: It was resolved to exempt the widow S--- from the \$13.00 which had been subscribed by her deceased husband but had not yet been paid.

It was resolved to pay the pastor this money from the congregation. The pastor stated that he would want his money only when once there is a surplus in the treasury.

It was further resolved to support the family of H. B--- because of the need they have at this time. The New Year's collection (\$4.10) is to be used for this purpose and it is hoped that everyone who has a heart for this cause, bring his gift to the pastor, who should then deliver them.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Library: The Book of the Month will be available in the Parish Hall library for you to look through and read. You may take the book home to read as well, but we ask that you please do not hold onto it for too long so other people can enjoy it as well. The July Book of the Month is *Law & Gospel: How to Read and Apply the Bible* by C.F.W. Walther. Here is an excerpt from the book: "When we compare Holy Scripture with other writings, we notice that no book seems to be as full of contradictions as the Bible. And this seems to be true not only in minor points but also even in its main point, namely, regarding the doctrine of how we may come to God and are saved.... This riddle can be solved when we consider that there are two entirely different doctrines in Scripture: the doctrine of the Law and the doctrine of the Gospel."

From Matt Riley: This past year we have been supporting seminarian Matt Riley. It is a wonderful thing for us to support a future pastor in Christ's Church! Each month he has been sending us a letter, which is posted on the bulletin board in the Parish Hall. Upon receiving our latest gift, he sent the following thank you: "Saints of St. Peter Lutheran, Thank you so much for your generous gift! Our family is truly blessed by the love and brotherhood of the Body of Christ. Your gift came at just the right time. God's richest blessings to you. In Christ alone, Seminarian Matt Riley & Jenn, Kati, Elli, Nate."

Pastor will continue to set up communion so that there is only one contact prior to communion distribution.)

Altar Flowers: If you would like to sponsor altar flowers, there is a sign-up sheet in the hallway between Pastor's office and the church office. The cost to sponsor the flowers is \$20, and the payment can be put in the offering plate or in the mail rack outside the church office door.
