Each week between now and our 150th anniversary celebration, the bulletin and/or announcements will include excerpts from some of our Church’s early board meeting minutes.

Below are some excerpts from Board Minutes from April 2, 1871 to October 6, 1912. These were written in German and translated by Rev. A. A. Mueller. It is worth noting how important church attendance and voter meeting attendance was and that being in church and living a life according to God’s Word was extremely important. Christian life was to be lived every day.

September 22, 1878: The meeting was opened with prayer. Then the admonition of Mr. --- took place. He, together with his wife, who had separated herself from him, had been summoned before the congregation. The woman had not appeared. She had already earlier stated that she would not come, saying it is no concern of the congregation or of the pastor when there are quarrels between marriage partners, etc. She had expressed herself before the pastor in an ungodly manner. And by the fact that she did not appear before the congregation, she has thereby excommunicated herself from the congregation. Mr. --- was then reproached with his sin, namely that he was living in disharmony with his wife and that he even mistreated her, also that he hardly ever comes to church on Sunday. He promised to do better and to make an attempt to be reconciled with his wife and to persuade her to return.

Below you will find a model you can use for your personal or family devotions that focuses you on the readings from the previous Sunday, while also preparing you for what you will hear the following Sunday. In modeling your devotions this way, you and your family can stay united to the church year and reinforce what you hear, sing, and pray every Sunday.

- Mon. 6/14: Read the Old Testament lesson: Ezekiel 17:22-24 – The Lord Himself will be the shelter for His people, providing the tree for their dwelling by His own hand.

Amen.
- Tues. 6/15: Read the Epistle lesson: 2 Corinthians 5:1-10 (11-17) – Even though we groan in this sinful world, let us be of good courage because we know that God has clothed us with Christ and will raise us from the dead on the last day.

- Wed. 6/16: Read the Gospel lesson: Mark 4:26-34 – God sows the seed of His Word so that we may sprout and grow in the faith. Like birds making nests in the shade of the plant, so too do we make our home in the Lord.

Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 6/14)
- Thur. 6/17: Read the Old Testament lesson: Job 38:1-11 – It is God who has created all things and He alone has dominion over them all. Do not fear, therefore, because all things are subject to God.
