Below you will find a model you can use for your personal or family devotions that focuses you on the readings from the previous Sunday, while also preparing you for what you will hear the following Sunday. Mon. 8/2: Read the Old Testament lesson: Exodus 16:2-15 – Even though the people grumbled against the Lord, He provided bread for them to eat so they may know that He is the Lord their God.

Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 918 – Guide Me, O Thou Great Redeemer Pray the Collect of the Day: Merciful Father, You gave Your Son Jesus as the heavenly bread of life. Grant us faith to feast on Him in Your Word and Sacraments that we may be nourished unto life everlasting; through the same Jesus Christ, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

Tues. 8/3: Read the Epistle lesson: Ephesians 4:1-16 – Let us, by the grace of God, grow up in maturity in Christ, ever learning His Word and doctrine. For God has called us to this very thing.

Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 918 – Guide Me, O Thou Great Redeemer Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 8/2)

Wed. 8/4: Read the Gospel lesson: John 6:22-35 – Jesus is the Bread of Life that the Father gives us so that we may know Him, believe in Him, and have eternal life.

Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 918 – Guide Me, O Thou Great Redeemer Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 8/2)

Thur. 8/5: Read the Old Testament lesson: 1 Kings 19:1-8 – As Elijah despaired due to the unbelief of his day, the Lord strengthened him through eating, drinking, and His word.

Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 534 – Lord, Enthroned in Heavenly Splendor Pray the Collect of the Day: Gracious Father, Your blessed Son came down from heaven to be the true bread that gives life to the world. Grant that Christ, the bread of life, may live in us and we in Him, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

Fri. 8/6: Read the Epistle lesson: Ephesians 4:17-5:2 – Let us walk in the way of Christ, in thought, word, and deed being imitators of God who loved us and gave Himself up for us.

Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 534 – Lord, Enthroned in Heavenly Splendor Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 8/5)

Sat. 8/7: Read the Gospel lesson: John 6:35-51 – Jesus has come down from heaven so He may raise us, who the Father draws to Himself, from the dead on the last day.

Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 534 – Lord, Enthroned in Heavenly Splendor Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 8/5)
