150th Anniversary Clean-up Days: With the 150th anniversary celebration almost here, now is a great time to do some clean-up around the church grounds. A list of cleaning needs is provided here in the newsletter (next page) and will also be posted in the Parish Hall. Feel free to come anytime July 5th-8th to check off an item or two on the list. If you would prefer to do clean-up with a group, we will meet on Monday, July 5th from 4:00-6:00 PM. Please consider helping out as you are able. Many hands make light work!

The schedule for July 11th is as follows: *10:30 Morning Worship *12:00 Luncheon *2:00 Anniversary Worship Service (reception to follow)

Each week between now and our 150th anniversary celebration, the bulletin and/or announcements will include excerpts from some of our Church's early board meeting minutes.

Below are some excerpts from Board Minutes from April 2, 1871 to October 6, 1912. These were written in German and translated by Rev. A. A. Mueller. It is worth noting how important church attendance and voter meeting attendance was and that being in church and living a life according to God's Word was extremely important. Christian life was to be lived every day.

<u>February 12, 1882</u>: Then we proceeded to calling of a pastor. Pastor H. Birkner of Gordonville, Mo. Was elected as pastor and shepherd of the congregation. The diploma of vocation was signed by the elders at the close of the meeting. (No further mention of Pastor Birkner is made in any following minutes.) The congregation resolved to ask Pastor Juengel to conduct services here every two weeks in the afternoon as long as we do not have our own pastor.

<u>July 2, 1893</u>: Since Pastor George Scheffer, because of illness, must resign from his office and therefore must announce to the congregation that he is resigning, those who were present graciously released him. Thereupon, it was resolved that Pastor George Sheffer serve the congregation as long as practicable. (Other documents list him as Pastor J. C. Schaefer.)

April 2, 1871: Singles used for the church were 14,000. \$15.50 has been paid, but \$19.50 is still owing. Each member was to bring 6 boards, 12' long, within 14 days, to fence the church cemetery and each one is to nail them himself.

October 21, 1871: Each member shall contribute 55¢ to pay the cost of repairing the parsonage. A cistern to be made for the pastor at his dwelling. Members volunteered to dig the cistern and furnish the materials for it. The bricks cost \$6.54.

<u>January 4, 1874</u>: Expenses for the new stable amounting to \$17.19 be equally divided among the members. There were 25 members at a cost of 70¢. Each member shall work 4 days for the congregation. Those who do not work are to pay \$1 for each day they have not worked. This rule can be in force only when no new buildings are to be erected.

<u>April 19, 1874</u>: Resolved to hire someone to whitewash the church. Taxes on the church's land must be paid. Each member to pay \$1. The property of the church has been estimated to be \$720. Taxes are \$11.52. From this deduct \$1.40 for road tax.

St. Peter, styled in the Gothic Revival style, laid its cornerstone in 1880. There is a central bell tower and is a one-room building. The congregation grew steadily and had a vision of constructing a new church building. Bricks for the church were made in Waymansville at the brick factory located southeast of the present store. One hundred twenty-five thousand bricks were required at a cost of \$4.50 per thousand. The new church building cost \$2.249.

The cornerstone for the present building was laid April 18, 1880 at a joint ceremony conducted by Pastors Wendt, Borchers and Juengel. The church needed a bell to summon all the community to worship, so in 1889 a set of bells was purchased for \$265 and are still in use today. The bells were delivered from Columbus to Waymansville by horses and wagon. It was customary for the sexton to toll the bells at six o'clock on Saturday evening to remind the members of the approaching Sunday, which was a day for worship.

The altar was installed around the year 1900. The new altar was purchased for \$65 and was to be 6' wide.

Below you will find a model you can use for your personal or family devotions that focuses you on the readings from the previous Sunday, while also preparing you for what you will hear the following Sunday. In modeling your devotions this way, you and your family can stay united to the church year and reinforce what you hear, sing, and pray every Sunday.

Mon. 7/5: Read the Old Testament lesson: Ezekiel 2:1-5 – The Lord sends His servants even in the midst of sinners so that they may repent as they hear the Word of God. Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 839 – O Christ, Our True and Only Light Pray the Collect of the Day: O God, Your almighty power is made known chiefly in showing mercy. Grant us the fullness of Your grace that we may be called to repentance and made partakers of Your heavenly treasures; through Your Son, Jesus Christ, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

Read the Epistle lesson: 2 Corinthians 12:1-10 – We boast, not in ourselves and our Tues. 7/6: strength, but in our weakness because the power of God is seen in making us strong even though we are weak. Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 839 – O Christ, Our True and Only Light Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 7/5)

Wed. 7/7: Read the Gospel lesson: Mark 6:1-13 – Even the people in His hometown did not believe in Jesus, Jesus, however, continues to send out His servants into all the world to call people to repentance and proclaim the Gospel of salvation. Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 839 – O Christ, Our True and Only Light Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 7/5)

Thur. 7/8: Read the Old Testament lesson: Amos 7:7-15 – Amos, like all of the servants of God, was sent by God to proclaim God's Word, not his own. Even when it was hard to hear, Amos remained faithful, speaking what God had given him to speak. Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 743 – Jesus, Priceless Treasure Pray the Collect of the Day: O Lord, You granted Your prophets strength to resist the temptations of the devil and courage to proclaim repentance. Give us pure hearts and minds to follow You Son faithfully even into suffering and death; through the same Jesus Christ, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

Fri. 7/9: Read the Epistle lesson: Ephesians 1:3-14 – Before the foundation of the world, we were chosen to receive the inheritance of Christ, which God lavishes upon us through the work of the Holy Spirit. Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 743 – Jesus, Priceless Treasure Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 7/8)

Sat. 7/10: Read the Gospel lesson: Mark 6:14-29 – John remained faithful even in the face of death, not being intimidated or coerced into denying the Word of God, but continuing to proclaim it and believe it. Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 743 – Jesus, Priceless Treasure

Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 7/8)
