Pray the Collect of the Day: Merciful Father, Your patience and loving-kindness toward us have no end. Grant that by Your Holy Spirit we may always think and do those things that are pleasing in Your sight; through Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

Tues. 10/5: Read the Epistle lesson: Hebrews 2:1-13 (14-18) – Jesus did not become an angel, but a man and He was crowned with glory and honor because He partook of suffering and death to save man.

Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 863 – Our Father, by Whose Name Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 10/4)

Wed. 10/6: Read the Gospel lesson: Mark 10:2-16 – Divorce only exists because of sin. Far greater is that a man and woman remain joined together, not separating by human means what God Himself has joined together in a one flesh union.
