### Let's Talk Chanting

There may be no more musical time of the year in the Church and even in the world than Advent and Christmas time. Of course, there are all of the Christmas carols, the music playing in the stores and on the radio, and the sound of bells ringing everywhere you go.

Beyond this, the Bible is full of music surrounding Christmas. The angels sing at the birth of Christ. Elizabeth and Mary break out into chant and song as they rejoice at the fulfillment of God's promises. Even Zechariah, the father of John the Baptist, who had been mute for months, started to sing as soon as God loosed his tongue.

From Genesis to Revelation, the Bible gives witness to the fact that God's people sing and chant in response to God's wonderful salvation. This gives a basis for why we sing and chant in church today. First, because God commands and encourages us to sing praises to His holy name. Second, because we witness the countless times God's people respond this way in Holy Scripture. Third, because singing and chanting help us remember the words of God and take them to heart with ease. And fourth, because singing and chanting (even by those who are less than musical) adds beauty and grandeur to the words we are using.

This is all good, right, and salutary and we should take time to learn from the biblical and practical witness to singing and chanting. But I also want to take a moment to reflect personally on why singing and chanting are so important to me. I offer this as a sincere and humble reflection for you to consider, even as I put into words my own personal feelings on the matter.

First off, I realize that not everyone is musically inclined. This is something I have struggled with my entire life. No one will ever confuse me with being a great singer or chanter. I fully acknowledge this. In fact, I am often very self-conscious of my voice and it has taken years for me to even feel comfortable being heard in public singing, and even more so when it comes to chanting. If this is a struggle for you, I completely understand where you are coming from on this.

I share this because, at least for me, it highlights why chanting is so important to me. Even though it is a struggle and even though I am far from great at it, nevertheless there has been such a great benefit to chanting for me that I want everyone to share that same joy and benefit as well.

I never grew up with chanting. The first few times I heard a pastor chant the liturgy, it was strange for me and I wasn't sure I even liked it. Over time, however, something strange began to happen. I started to learn the liturgy. Which meant I started to have phrases and verses of God's Word stuck in my mind. "Glory be to God on high... and on earth...," you can probably fill in the rest. (Luke 2:14, in this case)

That was just the first benefit. The second was that the liturgy, that is our weekly worship and the Word of God that makes up our liturgy, started to come to my mind randomly throughout the week. As I would be working on something, walking to class, or even driving in the car, these different chanted portions would start running through my head. What a joy it is to have the Word of God that readily available that I could recall it throughout my day!

Third, and finally, the chanting of the liturgy helped me on Sunday morning. Even though I struggled to get the notes and movement right for quite awhile (and still do sometimes), when the pastor began chanting his portion, I didn't have to try to find what the words of the response would be. The music led the response to my lips and I could focus more on what I was chanting in response, which, again, is the very Word of God. What a blessing that is!

This is merely my personal experience with chanting. I realize not everyone will experience it the same way. But it highlights for me that, though it may be strange or difficult or even distracting at first, over time chanting and singing bring great benefits and even greater joy.

I pray that all of us would be able to experience that joy of having God's Word in our hearts and our minds at a moment's notice. I pray that all of us would be able to focus more on what we are saying or singing or chanting because it is the very Word of God. I pray that all of us would recognize that we are the body of Christ and while something may not be a preference for one, it may be of immeasurable help and aid and joy for another.

I, for one, can say that chanting has be an immeasurable help and aid and joy for me. It has also been that way for countless other Christians throughout the ages and even in our congregation today. I do not chant because it is my preference musically. I chant because it has brought me great joy and I know it can do the same for all of us who are in Christ Jesus.

In the end, our focus should always turn to Christ and what He has done and is doing for us in worship. That is of the utmost importance in all the things we do. And in this season in particular, all of our words, our songs, and our chants, remind us of how Christ became flesh in order to save us from our sins. Thanks be to God for that! Glory to God in the highest and on earth peace, goodwill to men!

Here is an excerpt from the book: "Nicholas is a real historical figure who lived in the fourth century. He was Bishop of Myra, a city in Lycia, Asia Minor (what is modern-day Turkey).... As a Christian, Nicholas suffered persecution under the Roman Emperor Diocletian and was imprisoned until Constantine came into power and showed tolerance to Christians.... The significance of Nicholas for us today is that his response to God's great love for us in Jesus was to care for other people. His kindness and care for children are modeled every time we give a gift out of love."



#### **Book of Concord Corner**

"Our churches teach that the Word, that is, the Son of God (John 1:14), assumed the human nature in the womb of the Blessed Virgin Mary. So there are two natures – the divine and the human – inseparably joined in one person. There is one Christ, true God and true man, who was born of the Virgin Mary, truly suffered, was crucified, died, and was buried. He did this to reconcile the Father to us and to be a sacrifice, not only for original guilt, but also for all actual sins of mankind (John 1:29).

He also descended into hell, and truly rose again on the third day. Afterward, He ascended into heaven to sit at the right hand of the Father. There He forever reigns and has dominion over all creatures. He sanctifies those who believe in Him, by sending the Holy Spirit into their hearts to rule, comfort, and make them alive. He defends them against the devil and the power of sin.

The same Christ will openly come again to judge the living and the dead, and so forth, according to the Apostles' Creed." (Augsburg Confession, article III)

# Advent and Christmas Services

Advent is a season when the Church prepares for the coming (or advent) of Jesus Christ. This preparation is done by gathering together to hear the Word of God, repent of our sins, and receive the body and blood of Christ in the Lord's Supper.

Throughout this season, God reveals to us the three advents of Christ. First, He came in the flesh by His birth in Bethlehem. Second, He comes to us here and now in His Word and in His Sacraments. Third, He will come again on the last day to raise us from the dead.

As such, the Church uses this season to prepare for all three advents of Christ, celebrating the first, experiencing the second, and longing for the third. May this Advent and Christmas season be a blessed time of preparation for all of us here at St. Peter as we join together to delight in the Christ Child who comes to us now and will come again!
