Below you will find a model you can use for your personal or family devotions that focuses you on the readings from the previous Sunday, while also preparing you for what you will hear the following Sunday. In modeling your devotions this way, you and your family can stay united to the church year and reinforce what you hear, sing, and pray every Sunday.

- Mon. 2/14: Read the Old Testament lesson: Jeremiah 17:5-8 – Blessed is the man who trusts in the Lord because the Lord will always care for him.
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 394 – Songs of Thankfulness and Praise
Pray the Collect of the Day: O Lord, graciously hear the prayers of Your people that we who justly suffer the consequence of our sin may be mercifully delivered by Your goodness to the glory of Your name; through Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.
- Tues. 2/15: Read the Epistle lesson: 1 Corinthians 15:(1-11) 12-20 – Christ’s resurrection is the assurance of our own resurrections. As He is raised, so too we will be raised.
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 394 – Songs of Thankfulness and Praise
Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 2/14)
- Wed. 2/16: Read the Gospel lesson: Luke 6:17-26 – Blessed are all who believe in the Son of Man. Your reward is great in heaven, where Christ has gone before you.
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 394 – Songs of Thankfulness and Praise
Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 2/14)
- Thur. 2/17: Read the Old Testament lesson: Genesis 45:3-15 – Though his brothers sold him into slavery, Joseph forgave them and provided for them in the midst of famine.
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 834 – O God, O Lord of Heaven and Earth
Pray the Collect of the Day: O God, the strength of all who put their trust in You, mercifully grant that by Your power we may be defended against all adversity; through Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.
- Fri. 2/18: Read the Epistle lesson: 1 Corinthians 15:21-26, 30-42 – We are made alive in Christ who has destroyed even the power of death and who will give us a glorified resurrected body.
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 834 – O God, O Lord of Heaven and Earth
Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 2/17)
- Sat. 2/19: Read the Gospel lesson: Luke 6:27-38 – Because we have everything we could ever need in Christ, we are free to help our neighbor in every way.
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 834 – O God, O Lord of Heaven and Earth
Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 2/17)
