## **Lent: A Time for Learning**

Usually, the season of Lent is associated with repentance, and rightfully so. This season is, after all, a time to prepare for the events of Holy Week and Easter. Thus, this repentant season begins with ashes placed on the foreheads of the faithful while they hear the words, "Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return" (Genesis 3:19). Repentance is front and center as you see the sanctuary clothed in purple, the color of repentance. It's even the focus of so many of the biblical texts you'll hear on Sunday mornings and Wednesday evenings.

There is, however, another aspect of Lent that should be taken seriously and that is that Lent is a time for learning. Even from ancient times, that is from the earliest years of the Church, this has been a major focus of Lent.

On the one hand, the Church would use this season to catechize new members in the one, true faith. Those who were previously not Christian would undergo 40 days filled with Scripture and learning from their pastor and their fellow saints. The season would culminate with them being baptized, confirmed in the faith, and/or welcomed to commune at the altar of God for the very first time.

On the other hand, the Church would use this season to come together as those who were already in the faith to learn further the Word of God. This is where the practice of midweek Lenten services originated. These services were meant to provide the whole church a chance to be in the Word of God even more and to learn things that may not ordinarily come up on a normal Sunday morning.

Along with this, several other practices developed to teach the things of God. This is the point of doing things like encouraging devotions even more during these 40 days, omitting the Gloria in Excelsis from the Divine Service, and veiling the crosses in the church. Each of these practices are not simply traditions for tradition's sake, but each of them seeks to teach something important about Christ and the faith.

As we begin our Lenten journey this year (Ash Wednesday is on March 2<sup>nd</sup>), let us together strive to use this time for learning. After all, Scripture encourages us to never be content, but to always long to learn more of God's Word.

Proverbs says, "Let the wise hear and increase in learning," (1:5) and "Give instruction to a wise man, and he will be still wiser; teach a righteous man, and he will increase in learning" (9:9). Psalm 1 speaks to this reality. Christ speaks repeatedly of abiding in Him and in His Word. St. Paul encourages Christians to continuously be trained up by the Word.

Of course, there is no one way to do this and it's not a Law you must follow. Consider, however, how you might be able to learn and grow during this season of Lent. Consider how you might be able to appreciate something you may never have appreciated before in the church.

Perhaps it's by coming to the midweek services. Perhaps it's by coming to Bible study with your fellow saints. Perhaps it's by doing devotions at home with your family. Perhaps it's by asking questions about why we do what we do while being willing to listen and learn.

I encourage you, therefore, to step out of your comfort zone this Lenten season. Don't just use this season to give something up or to eat more fish. Instead, use this time to learn and grow. To ask questions and receive

instruction. To be part of what Scripture says in Proverbs 27:17, "Iron sharpens iron, and one man sharpens another."

For truly, even the wisest person among us still has much he or she can learn regarding the faith and God's Word. So let us learn together, sharpening one another with the Word of God. Let us learn together, growing up in Christ, who is our true Teacher. Let us learn together, and all the more as we prepare to celebrate our Lord's resurrection!

He rules men's hearts with the truth of God's saving love. He is the King who was born to die on a cross, to destroy the evil that began in the Garden of Eden. Pilate asks: "What is truth?" And the truth is we are all sinners who have rejected God. We deserve nothing but punishment and death. The truth is the innocent Son of God who came to take our punishment and death into His own body. He came to exchange our sin and guilt for His innocence. Pilate's words are true: "I find no guilt in Him." And yet Christ bears the guilt of all!"



#### **Book of Concord Corner**

"Now, whoever does not highly value the Sacrament shows that he has no sin, no flesh, no devil, no world, no death, no danger, no hell. In other words, he does not believe any such things, although he is in them up over his head and his ears and is doubly the devil's own. On the other hand, he needs no grace, no life, no paradise, no heaven, no Christ, no God, nor anything good. For if he believed that he had so much evil around him, and needed so much that is good, he would not neglect the Sacrament, by which such evil is remedied and so much good is bestowed. Nor would it be necessary to force him to go to the Sacrament by any law. He would come running and racing of his own will, would force himself, and beg that you must give him the Sacrament." (Introduction to the Small Catechism, 23)


