# Waiting for the Resurrection

This year Easter falls on April 17<sup>th</sup>. That day we will celebrate with great joy the resurrection of our Lord. We will break out of our Lenten fast. We will sing with glad hearts and rejoice to hear again of our Lord's triumph over sin, death, and the devil.

The joy of Easter, however, is lessened if you don't take time to wait for the resurrection. That's a tough thing for us to hear in this day and age. We don't like to wait for anything. Our schedules are full and our time is precious. We want to keep things moving as quickly as we can so we can get to yet more things.

Yet, as Christians, we are called to wait. That is what Holy Week is all about. Beginning on Palm Sunday the entire Church Year slows way down. No longer do we move from one week to the next. During this week, we move dayto-day, even hour-to-hour. We walk with our Lord through every event of that week, not skipping around, not cutting things out, not being hasty to just get it over with.

Instead, we wait. We stop idolizing time and our schedules, and we devote our focus to Christ. On Thursday evening, we wait with our Lord in the upper room and in the Garden of Gethsemane. On Friday, we wait with our Lord through His trials and on Golgotha as He suffers and dies. On Saturday, we wait with our Lord in the tomb, as He rests from all of His work to make us a new creation.

Each of these services are more than mere reenactments of what happened almost 2000 years ago. Rather, each of these services are telling us who we are. They remind us of what it means to be a Christian. For each of these services unfold for us the history of salvation. How God created us, how He chose us in Christ, how He liberated us from the bondage of sin, how He planted us in His promised land, and how He brings this all to completion in the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus.

And this is something which requires us to wait. To listen as God unfolds this marvelous salvation to us. And though we've heard it all before, God calls us to hear it again and again because the world is always telling us something different. The world is always telling us we are something other than what God says. The world is always trying to take more of our time so we devote less time to what God has to say.

If we give in to the world and its demands on our time, if we don't wait for our Lord's resurrection, we can be sure that the joy of that resurrection will be lessened for us. We may not realize it as we gather together on Easter morning, but that's exactly the point. We will smile and rejoice and think we experienced everything Easter has to offer, but we'll be wrong. We'll be missing out on the fullness of Christ's resurrection and all because we didn't wait.

This Holy Week, then, dear saints, I encourage you to wait. To come to each and every service that week. To not worship the idols of time or your schedules. Come to Palm Sunday, to Holy (Maundy) Thursday, to Good Friday, and to the Easter Vigil. Come to hear again what it means to be a Christian as God unfolds the fullness of His salvation. Come to wait with your brothers and sisters in Christ for the resurrection of Christ.

As you do, as you wait for Christ's resurrection by hearing His Word in each of these services, you'll see how the joy of Easter is magnified. As you wait, the wonders of Christ's resurrection will grow. As you wait, your gladness will increase. As you wait, you'll see how God and His triumph over sin, death, and the devil are even more profound than you could imagine.

But where did these hymns come from, and why were they written? The hymn texts that we cherish today were often fashioned as a witness to the faith in response to tragic events, episodes of illness, or occasions of blessing and joy in the life of the hymnwriter. Alternatively, the need for a special hymn may have been the impetus for a new text. Today, Christians connect these experiences to their own lives by using the hymns to comfort one another and proclaim Christ through faithful witness as if the hymns were written just for them."



### **Book of Concord Corner**

"Our adversaries object by accusing our teachers of being against discipline and the subduing of the flesh. Just the opposite is true, as can be learned from our teachers' writings. They have always taught that Christians are to bear the cross (Matthew 16:24) by enduring afflictions. This is genuine and sincere subduing of the flesh (1 Peter 2:11), to be crucified with Christ through various afflictions. Furthermore, they teach that every Christian ought to train and subdue himself with bodily restraints, or bodily exercises and labors. Then neither overindulgence nor laziness may tempt him to sin. But they do not teach that we may merit grace or make satisfaction for sins by such exercises. Such outward discipline ought to be taught at all times, not only on a few set days. Christ commands, 'Watch yourselves lest your hearts be weighed down with dissipation and drunkenness' (Luke 21:34). Also in Matthew 17:21, 'This kind never comes out except by prayer and fasting.' Paul also says, 'I discipline my body and keep it under control' (1 Corinthians 9:27). Here he clearly shows that he was keeping his body under control, not to merit forgiveness of sins by that discipline, but to keep his body in subjection and prepared for spiritual things, for carrying out the duties of his calling. Therefore, we do not condemn fasting in itself (Isaiah 58:3-7), but the traditions that require certain days and certain meats, with peril of conscience, as though such works were a necessary service." (Augsburg Confession, XXVI, 30-39)

# Lent and Holy Week Services

Lent is a special 40-day season during which the Church reflects on her sin and on her need for a Savior. It is a time for us to turn our focus away from the things of this world and toward Christ, our dear Lord. As such, it is most appropriate for the Church to gather together more often during this season as we wait with anticipation for the joy of Easter. It is my prayer that all of us here at St. Peter would join together during this special season as we repent of our sin and look for the death and resurrection of Christ.


