For Christ's resurrection not only proves the truth of all of God's Word, but it also is the substance of what you confess. If you aren't sure what to say to someone who doesn't believe, in other words, simply give witness to Christ's death and resurrection.

Since Christ is raised from the dead, you can be generous, both with your offerings and with your aid to those in need. For Christ's resurrection opens to you the full kingdom of God and all its treasures, allowing you to be generous in this world because you realize you are losing nothing in the world to come.

Since Christ is raised from the dead, you can forgive one another everything just as your Lord has forgiven you. For Christ's resurrection shows that forgiveness is His and He gives it to you to speak to your fellow brothers and sisters in Christ.

Since Christ is raised from the dead, you can love your neighbors, all of them. For Christ's resurrection allows you to escape the politics of this world and love people, not based on agendas or ideologies, but on the fact that Christ has died for that person to forgive him all of his sins and He has risen again to give that person life everlasting.

Since Christ is raised from the dead, you can joyfully fulfill all of your vocations. For Christ's resurrection not only gives you eternal joy, but it also frees you to serve others in whatever way God calls you to do so, since your salvation is secured by Christ rising from the tomb, not from you or your works.





#### **Book of Concord Corner**

"We believe, teach, and confess that Mary conceived and bore not merely a man and no more, but God's true Son. Therefore, she is rightly called and truly is 'the mother of God.' 8. We also believe, teach, and confess that it was not a mere man who suffered, died, was buried, descended to hell, rose from the dead, ascended into heaven, and was raised to God's majesty and almighty power for us. But it was a man whose human nature has such a profound (close), indescribable union and communion with God's Son that it is one person with Him. 9. God's Son truly suffered for us. However, He did so according to the attributes of the human nature, which He received into the unity of His divine person and made His own. He did this so that He might be able to suffer and be our High Priest for our reconciliation with God, as it is written in 1 Corinthians 2:8, they 'crucified the Lord of glory.' And Acts 20:28 says, with God's blood we have been redeemed. 10. We believe, teach, and confess that the Son of Man really is exalted. He is (in deed and truth) exalted according to His human nature to the right hand of God's almighty majesty and power. For He was received into God when He was conceived of the Holy Spirit in His mother's womb, and His human nature was personally united with the Son of the Highest." (Formula of Concord, Epitome, Article VIII, 12-15)
