Don't Vacation from Church

School is out and summer vacations are beginning. Even if you do not have any children in school, summer is still a time of travel and vacation for many people. These vacations are times of much needed rest and relaxation, allowing you to unplug from your normal day-to-day life and take a break from the usual hustle and bustle.

Sadly, however, this often includes taking a vacation from church. The reasons for this are many. It's hard to find a church to go to away from home. It's awkward to go to a church you don't know, where you won't know anybody. There's no room in the suitcase for church clothes. You go to church every other week at home, so why not take a break for just one week while on vacation?

But it's not just taking a vacation from church while traveling that's a problem during summer. That same mindset creeps in even at home. The weather's so nice, so why not take a Sunday morning off? If I go to church, I may be too tired to do my fair work or the leisure activities I want. If our service time was earlier, then I would go so I wouldn't be wasting a whole summer morning by going to church.

I'm sure you could add on other reasons (or if you're being honest, excuses) why you might skip church during the summer, whether at home or on vacation. We all have them and we all have either used them before or have seriously thought about it.

That's why I want to encourage you: don't vacation from church.

At home, don't take a week or two off just because it's summer. All those activities you have, all the things you hope to do, will still be waiting for you after church and Bible study are over. It may not seem like it, but even taking a week or two off can quickly become a habit. Once you start vacationing from church at home, it gets easier and easier to be separated from God's life-giving Word and Sacraments. It gets easier and easier to remove yourself from the place where God lavishes His grace and mercy and forgiveness upon you.

While on vacation away from home, make an effort to go to church anyway. Yes, this can be difficult or awkward, but try it! If you are going somewhere, look up churches in the area ahead of time. I would even be more than happy to look up churches for you and help you find a great place to go so you can hear God's Word and be fed His body and blood while you vacation. What better refreshment and rest can there be than that?!

If you can't find a church near your vacationing spot, do a devotion with your family. Husbands/fathers/heads of the household, bring a hymnal with you (or use the devotional resources on the church website – http://stpeterwaymansville.com/) and lead your family through a devotion. Read a passage of Holy Scripture. Read a part of the Catechism. Listen to my sermon online (also posted every Sunday on the church website). It doesn't have to be big or fancy, but stay in the Word of God. Hear His Word and receive His gifts with your family. It may even be one of the highlights of your vacation!

Yes, church can sometimes slip into being just another piece of the routine for you, becoming another thing you feel you just need a vacation from, but remember what Jesus says: "Come to me, all who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls."

So, when it comes time for you to rest this summer, or anytime, don't vacation from church. Rather, go to church because you know that Jesus is there to give you rest. In Him and in the gifts He brings in worship, you will indeed find rest and relaxation unlike anything else this world has to offer.



Book of Concord Corner

"The word holiday is used for the Hebrews word sabbath, which properly means 'to rest,' that is, to cease from labor.... On this day of rest (since we can get no other chance), we have the freedom and time to attend divine service. We come together to hear and use God's Word, and then to praise God, and to sing and to pray (Colossians 3:16).... People must have holidays.

Therefore, such observances should be devoted to hearing God's Word so that the special function of this day of rest should be the ministry of the Word for the young and the mass of poor people (Nehemiah 8:2-3, 8). Yet the resting should not be strictly understood to forbid any work that comes up, which cannot be avoided." (Martin Luther, Large Catechism Part 1, 79, 84, 86)


