## The Church Is Not a Business

There's a very common sentiment today that the Church is a business (or at least, it's like a business). The thinking goes that if the Church wants to be successful, she must run things like a successful business. We must have mission and vision statements. We must cater to our customers. We must market ourselves in a way that's attractive to non-customers. We must prioritize running a surplus, etc.

While this sentiment is well-meaning because it comes from people wanting the Church to succeed, it's ultimately misguided and dangerous for the Church. It's misguided because it makes the Church focus on earthly success, particularly when it comes to numbers like attendance and budgets. It's dangerous because it tempts the Church to forsake Christ and His Word if that's not what the "customers" want.

Now, this isn't to say the Church doesn't need a budget or that the Church should do nothing to bring in new people. We do need to budget in order to faithfully use what God has given us. We do need to reach out to non-members and pray that they will join the Church. When these things become our only or primary focus, however, the driving force for everything we do, we're headed in a dangerous direction.

Because the Church is not a business. And if it was, it would be the worst business of all time, because everything the Church has, she gives away for free. The Word and the Sacraments are given by the Church to all, whether they give abundantly or give nothing at all.

So, no. The Church is not a business. Rather, the Church is the faithful people of God who listen to His voice and receive His gifts together.

The number one task, then, for the Church is to remain faithful. In our worship, in our teaching, in our life together, we are to remain faithful. If we remain faithful, clinging to the whole counsel of God in all its truth and purity, we have nothing to fear. Not even the gates of hell will overcome a faithful Church (Matthew 16:18).

From here, everything else will fall into place. A faithful Church will know its mission and vision is to proclaim the Gospel to all the world. A faithful Church will care for people in the best way possible, by giving them the forgiveness of sins and eternal life that Christ has won for all people. A faithful Church will reach out to non-members because she desires for them to hear of Christ and receive His salvation. A faithful Church will give joyfully and abundantly to support this work and mission, because she sees and knows how much God has given to her.

And then, a faithful Church will rest. She will do the work God has given her to do, but in the end, she will rest knowing that God alone is in charge of the results. If the Church grows, all praise and glory and credit to God. If the Church shrinks, all praise and glory and credit to God. Because He is the Lord of the Church and He will watch over and care for her in all things, doing what's best for her at all times.

This runs against so much of our experience. This doesn't make sense to our business-oriented minds. This upsets us because it takes the Church out of our control. And that's precisely the point. The Church is unlike anything else in all the world. It's not the goal of the Church to succeed, because our success is found in Christ alone. It's not the goal of the Church to be profitable, because our greatest riches are God's free gifts of forgiveness and salvation. It's

not the goal of the Church to be in control, because our Lord and Savior sits on the throne and is Himself the head of the Church.

The Church is not a business. It's the body of Christ. Let us always look to our Head and follow where He leads us.



**Book of the Month:** The Book of the Month will be available in the Parish Hall library for you to look through and read. The July Book of the Month is *"Letters from a Pastor's Heart"* by Matthew C. Harrison Here is an excerpt from the book: "The greatest eras in the history of the Church have all begun with repentance. Those times when the Gospel of free forgiveness by faith in Jesus Christ has shone brightest in missionary witness and expansion – in a burning desire to care for the weak and needy with Christ's own mercy, and in zealous and creative endeavors in church life and organization – have all begun with the preaching of repentance. It's hardly a coincidence that John the Baptizer's first recorded words were 'Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand!' (Matthew 3:2)."


#### LCMS COMMUNITY NEWS & EVENTS

#### **Book of Concord Corner**

"We believe, teach, and confess that the only rule and norm according to which all teachings, together with all teachers, should be evaluated and judged (2 Timothy 3:15-17) are the prophetic and apostolic Scriptures of the Old and New Testament alone. For it is written in Psalm 119:105, 'Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path.' St. Paul has written, 'even if we or an angel from heaven should preach to you a gospel contrary to the one we preached to you, let him be accursed' (Galatians 1:8). However, other writings by ancient or modern teachers – no matter whose name they bear – must not be regarded as equal to the Holy Scriptures (1 Corinthians 14:32). Other writings should not be received in any other way or as anything more than witnesses that show how this pure doctrine of the prophets and apostles was preserved after the time of the apostles, and at what places." (Formula of Concord, Summary, 1-2)


