#### Labor in the Lord

St. Paul writes in 1 Corinthians 15:58, "Therefore, my beloved brothers, be steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, knowing that in the Lord your labor is not in vain."

As our country pauses on the first Monday of September in observance of Labor Day, let us reflect on these words from our Lord. For truly, even in the Garden of Eden, God created us to labor, to work in this world. In this way, we do well not to see work as merely a chore or a means to an end, but as a gift from the Lord.

That's not always easy to do, however, especially since the Fall into sin brought pain and agony to work. Yet, even with the curses of sin added to it, work and labor remain a gift from our Creator.

These words from St. Paul remind us of the reason why. Doing the work God has given us, laboring in our many and various vocations, is never in vain. Instead, God is always accomplishing His purposes through our work.

Sometimes that means that God is caring for us directly. Perhaps that is through earning a paycheck or keeping the house clean and livable. Sometimes that means God is caring for the creation. This occurs as we mow the grass or plant a garden or work the fields. Sometimes, and perhaps more often than we realize, that means God is caring for our neighbor. This God does as our work benefits our customers, provides food and clothing for our spouse and children, aids those in need, and so on.

The devil loves it when we make work solely about me and what I can get out of it, because then it is easy to despise work or avoid it if there doesn't seem to be a benefit to me personally. But God reminds us that even when our work doesn't seem to benefit us directly, it is never in vain.

What a joy this is! And what a defense this is against the attacks of the devil. After all, times will come when we want to grumble about doing various kinds of labor (taking out the trash, going to work the next day, volunteering to help with an event, etc.), but we realize even these labors, as we do them in the Lord, are not in vain. They are bearing fruit, perhaps for ourselves, the creation, or our neighbor, in ways that we may not always see.

Thus, dear saints, as we observe Labor Day once again this year, take it as an opportunity to reflect on all of the different kinds of work or labor that God has given you and how, in that labor, you are God's hands and feet to serve in this world.

When we view our labor in this way, it can lead us to truly appreciate the opportunity to work. Even if my work doesn't bring me an immediate and direct benefit, I know that God is using it for His good and gracious purposes. Be steadfast and immovable, then, in your labor because, in the Lord, it is never in vain! It is always to His praise and glory as He uses it for good no matter what.



**Book of the Month:** The Book of the Month will be available in the Parish Hall library for you to look through and read. You may take the book home to read as well, but we ask that you please do not hold onto it for too long so other people can enjoy it as well. The September Book of the Month is "The Lutheran Difference: An Explanation & Comparison of Christian Beliefs." Here is an excerpt from the book: "As Lutherans interact with other Christians, they often find themselves struggling to explain their beliefs and practices. Although many Lutherans have learned the 'what' of the doctrines of the Church, they do not always have a full scriptural foundation to share the 'why.' When confronted with different doctrines or denominations, they sometimes cannot clearly state their faith — much less understand the differences. Because of insecurities about explaining particular doctrines or practices, some Lutherans may avoid opportunities to share what they have learned from Christ and His Word. The Lutheran Difference identifies how Lutherans differ from other Christians and show from the Bible why Lutherans differ."



#### **Book of Concord Corner**

"Let us, then, learn well the First Commandment, that we may see how God will tolerate no overconfidence nor any trust in any other object. We will see how He requires nothing greater from us than confidence from the heart for everything good. Then we may live right and straightforward and use all the blessings that God gives, just as a shoemaker uses his needle, awl, and thread for work and then lays them aside. Or we may behave like a traveler using an inn, food, and bed only to meet his present need. Each person may dot his in his calling, according to God's order, and without allowing any of these things to be his lord or idol. This is enough about the First Commandment, which we have had to explain at length, since it is of chief importance. For, as said earlier, where the heart is rightly set toward God (Deuteronomy 32:46) and this commandment is observed, all the other commandments follow." (Large Catechism I, 47)
