The 95 Theses

Everyone knows the story, at least a little bit. On All Hallows' Eve (that is October 31, the night before All Saints' (Hallows') Day on November 1), a monk named Martin Luther nailed his 95 Theses onto the church doors at Wittenberg, Germany. This act ignited the Reformation and the rest is history.

If you dig a little deeper, you'll probably find people talking about how scandalous this action was. "How dare Luther nail something to the church doors!" is often their cry, even though in reality the church doors in those days served like a bulletin board with many things being nailed to them. Or you'll hear people discuss how brave Luther was to take on the Roman Catholic Church with such an action.

While both of these, and many other interpretations that get thrown around, may be fun to consider, the truth of this event is a bit more boring. For this action was really more of an academic exercise. Luther was doing what everyone did in those days in a college town. He was posting a list of theses (essentially topics, assertions, or claims) that he was hoping they could debate and discuss in pursuit of finding the truth. It was hardly a scandal and it wasn't as heroic of an action as we may want it to be.

The real magnificence of this moment, however, was what was contained in those 95 Theses. Some of them were wrong or missed the mark slightly, which is alright because they opened a door to clarify the truth. Others, though, were marvelous and focused the discussion back on Scripture and justification through faith in Christ alone.

If you have never read or heard some of these theses, here are a few good ones to hear.

1. When our Lord and Master Jesus Christ, said "Repent" (Mt. 4:17), he willed the entire life of believers to be one of repentance.

36. Any truly repentant Christian has a right to full remission of penalty and guilt, even without indulgence letters.

37. Any true Christian, whether living or dead, participates in all the blessings of Christ and the church; and this is granted him by God, even without indulgence letters.

62. The true treasure of the church is the most holy gospel of the glory and grace of God.

94. Christians should be exhorted to be diligent in following Christ, their Head, through penalties, death and hell.

95. And thus be confident of entering into heaven through many tribulations rather than through the false security of peace (Acts 14:22).

As we celebrate the 505th anniversary of the posting of the 95 Theses this year, let us remember what was truly important in this event. The Gospel was being preached. Christ was at the center. The forgiveness of sins, without any need of payment or indulgence, was proclaimed once more to God's people.

Thanks be to God, therefore, that through Martin Luther the Church was reminded that her true treasure is the Gospel and that she should follow Christ, her Head, through all things unto life eternal. As true as this was back then in 1517 AD, it remains true for us today and for all the days yet to come. Soli Deo Gloria! To God alone be the Glory! Verbum Domini Manet in Aeternum! The Word of the Lord endures forever!



Book of the Month: The Book of the Month will be available in the Parish Hall library for you to look through and read. You may take the book home to read as well, but we ask that you please do not hold onto it for too long so other people can enjoy it as well. The October Book of the Month is *"Martin Luther: A Man Who Changed the World"* by Paul L. Maier. Here is an excerpt from the book: "Our loving God helps His people turn from sin and error. In the Old Testament, He sent prophets to warn them. In the New Testament, He even sent His own Son, Jesus Christ, to reform and save the world. And in the centuries since then, God sent others to keep the church pure. The greatest of these was Martin Luther, an extraordinary man who started the Reformation just when the church needed it most. Martin was born at Eisleben in Germany in 1483 – nine years before Columbus sailed to America! In those days, the Christian church no longer based its beliefs on

the Bible alone. It had actually invented new doctrines and practices that Jesus and His apostles had never taught. Sadly, too, the church leaders of that time, far from setting a good example for their people, sinned worse than the people did! Martin Luther would change all that."

Board Positions: At our October voters' meeting, we will elect new board members for the positions of chairman, financial secretary, and practical services. If you would be willing to serve in any of these roles, please let a current board member know.

Quarterly Voters' Meeting: We will have our quarterly voters' meeting on October 2nd following the worship service.

College Outreach and Care: As a new school year begins, we will continue our college outreach and care program for our college students. If you are going to college (or know a member who is going to college), please let Pastor Sorenson know so he can add you to the list.

Thrivent Action Teams: If you have any Thrivent policies or products, you are eligible for two action teams a year. 

Book of Concord Corner

"You must also know how to use God's name rightly. For when He says, 'You shall not take the name of the Lord, your God, in vain,' He wants us to understand at the same time that His name is to be used properly. For His name has been revealed and given to us so that it may be of constant use and profit. So it is natural to conclude that since this commandment forbids using the holy name for falsehood or wickedness, we are, on the other hand, commanded to use His name for truth and for all good, like when someone takes an oath truthfully when it is needed and it is demanded (Numbers 30:2). This commandment also applies to right teaching and to calling on His name in trouble or praising and thanking Him in prosperity, and so on." (Large Catechism I, 63-64)
