House of Bread

- Pastor Sorenson

"O little town of Bethlehem, how still we see thee lie! Above thy deep and dreamless sleep the silent stars go by; yet in thy dark streets shineth the everlasting light. The hopes and fears of all the years are met in thee tonight." (LSB 361, stanza 1)

This hymn is one of many beloved Christmas hymns. It starts out by hearkening to the small town of Bethlehem, the very place where Jesus Christ was born. Even though Bethlehem wasn't a very prominent city, just about everybody knows about it because of this fact.

Some other well-known facts about Bethlehem are that it is the home of king David, that it's near Jerusalem, and that it was the home to many shepherds. Each of these are important features of Bethlehem that speak to various parts of the Christmas story.

What many people don't know, however, is what the name Bethlehem means. It comes from two different Hebrew words: *beth* which means "house" and *lehem* which means "bread." Quite literally, then, the town is known as "house of bread." What an odd name for a town.

That name, though, provides a wonderful backdrop for the birth of Jesus. For our Savior was born in the house of bread and that's no coincidence.

First, there's the simple fact that bread is food and it's often used as a catchall word for the basic necessity for what we need to survive. How appropriate, then, that God would be born in a town that bears the name for a basic necessity for life.

Second, there's a few Old Testament connections to bread that take on added significance in light of the birth of Jesus in Bethlehem. Think of the manna, bread from heaven, which God used to feed His people during the Exodus. Or consider the seemingly odd request of God that "you shall set the bread of the Presence on the table before me regularly" in the tabernacle (Exodus 25:30). Now, these Old Testament details make more sense seeing that God would take on flesh and be born in the house of bread.

Third, and perhaps most significantly, the name of Bethlehem connects us to later statements of Jesus such as when He says, "I am the bread of life" (John 6:35). Or later when "Jesus took bread, and after blessing it broke it and gave it to the disciples and said, 'Take, eat; this is my body'" (Matthew 26:26).

The Lord who was born in the house of bread now gives us His very body in, with, and under bread. This bodybread gives us life because it gives us Jesus. This body-bread is our manna from heaven and our bread of the Presence. This body-bread is the basic necessity which nourishes our faith and keeps us alive.

Truly, it's no coincidence that Jesus was born in Bethlehem, the house of bread. For even as a newborn, He is the Bread of life who was born to be our everlasting light. In Him, all our hopes and fears are met because He took on flesh to die on the cross so that we may be saved. And now, every time we receive the bread in the Lord's Supper, we're connected back to this Christmas joy, because it's no longer just bread, but it's also the body of the One born in the house of bread.




FROM THE OFFICE

Book of Concord Corner

"1. The divine and human natures in Christ are personally united. So there are not two Christs, one the Son of God and the other the Son of Man. But one and the same person is the Son of God and Son of Man (Luke 1:35; Romans 9:5).

2. We believe, teach, and confess that the divine and human natures are not mingled into one substance, nor is one changed into the other. Each keeps its own essential properties, which can never become the properties of the other nature.

3. The properties of the divine nature are these: to be almighty, eternal, infinite, and to be everywhere present (according to the property of its nature and its natural essence, of itself), to know everything, and so on. These never become properties of the human nature.

4. The properties of the human nature are to be a bodily creature, to be flesh and blood, to be finite and physically limited, to suffer, to die, to ascend and descend, to move from one place to another, to suffer hunger, thirst, cold, heat, and the like. These never become properties of the divine nature.

5. The two natures are united personally (i.e., in one person). Therefore, we believe, teach, and confess that this union is not the kind of joining together and connection that prevents either nature from having anything in common with the other personally (i.e., because of the personal union). It is not like when two boards are glued together, where neither gives anything to the other or takes anything from the other....

For how could the man, the Son of Mary, in truth be called or be God, or the Son of God the Most High, if His humanity were not personally united with the Son of God?" (Formula of Concord, Epitome, VIII, 5-9, 11)

Advent and Christmas Services

Advent is a season when the Church prepares for the coming (or advent) of Jesus Christ. This preparation is done by gathering together to hear the Word of God, repent of our sins, and receive the body and blood of Christ in the Lord's Supper.

Throughout this season, God reveals to us the three advents of Christ. First, He came in the flesh by His birth in Bethlehem. Second, He comes to us here and now in His Word and in His Sacraments. Third, He will come again on the last day to raise us from the dead.

As such, the Church uses this season to prepare for all three advents of Christ, celebrating the first, experiencing the second, and longing for the third. May this Advent and Christmas season be a blessed time of preparation for all of us here at St. Peter as we join together to delight in the Christ Child who comes to us now and will come again!
