On Repentance and Forgiveness

The season of Lent is a season of repentance. You see that in the color purple that adorns the church this time of year. You hear that in the readings and the hymns. You read about that in special Lenten devotions. As such, Lent is a perfect time to consider what repentance really is.

The word "repent" literally means "to turn around." The picture for repentance, then, is the process of turning from facing one direction to the opposite direction. More specifically, repentance is going from facing sin and the ways of the devil to facing God and His ways. It's recognizing the destruction of sin and desiring instead the things of God.

This is the proclamation of Lent. "Return to the Lord your God." Turn back from sin and face the Lord once again.

Practically speaking, repentance begins with contrition, that is sorrow over sin. This contrition doesn't have to be an intense feeling of sorrow, however. Sometimes contrition is simply acknowledging that you have sinned. That even your best works in this life are done in sin. Sometimes this leads to a stricken conscience and intense sorrow. Sometimes it leads to a confession without much emotion, but the sorrow over sin remains.

This helps to clarify a point that is often missed with repentance. Repentance, properly speaking, is God's action. He is the One who starts repentance in you. His Word comes to you, striking at your heart, convicting you of your sins. From here, God begins to turn you around away from these sins and back to Himself.

That is so important to know. Otherwise, you could never be sure if your repentance was genuine. But it is, because God is the One who works it in you. It is also quite comforting, because no matter how many times you turn yourself around to face sin once again, God goes to work to spin you back around, away from sin, and back to Himself.

Just as repentance begins with contrition, then, it finds its end in faith and forgiveness. Martin Luther says it well in the Small Catechism as he writes, "Confession has two parts. First, that we confess our sins, and second, that we receive absolution, that is forgiveness, from the pastor as from God Himself, not doubting, but firmly believing that by it our sins are forgiven before God in heaven."

This knowledge is not only a great comfort for you, but it's a great encouragement for you as well. It's a comfort because when you feel the sting of the God's Law, when His Word cuts right to your heart, you know that God has done that in order to bring you forgiveness. Your sins are placed before your eyes because God is about to turn you away from them and back to Jesus who has already taken those sins to the cross in His very own flesh.

Repentance ending with forgiveness is an encouragement for you as well, because God calls you to forgive just as He has forgiven you. When your brother or sister in Christ sins against you and as God brings him or her to acknowledge that sin, you boldly proclaim Christ's forgiveness. You serve as the mask of God in that moment as He turns your fellow believer back to Himself.

When you understand repentance and forgiveness in this biblical way, what a great joy this call to repent is during Lent! Likewise, when you see the connection between repentance and forgiveness, what a great weight is lifted off of your shoulders as you interact with one another. For when God calls His people to repent, you know that His forgiveness will have the final word.

So, repent, dear Christians! For by Christ's death and resurrection, your sins are forgiven and by God's grace, you live in His forgiveness all the days of your life.



Book of Concord Corner

"This is what true repentance means. Here a person needs to hear something like this, 'You are all of no account, whether you are obvious sinners or saints in your own opinion. You have to become different from what you are now. You have to act differently than you are now acting, however great, wise, powerful, and holy you try to be. Here no one is godly.' But to this office of the Law, the New Testament immediately adds the consoling promise of grace through the Gospel. This must be believed. As Christ declares, 'Repent and believe in the gospel' (Mark 1:15). That is, become different, act differently, and believe my promise. ... Whenever the Law alone exercises its office, without the Gospel being added, there is nothing but death and hell, and one must despair, as Saul and Judas did (1 Samuel 31; Matthew 27:5). St. Paul says, through sin the Law kills. (See Romans 7:10.) On the other hand, the Gospel brings consolation and forgiveness. It does so not just in one way, but through the Word and the Sacraments." (Smalcald Articles, Part III, Article III, 3-4, 7-8)

Lent and Holy Week Services

Lent is a special 40-day season during which the Church reflects on her sin and on her need for a Savior. It is a time for us to turn our focus away from the things of this world and toward Christ, our dear Lord. As such, it is most appropriate for the Church to gather together more often during this season as we wait with anticipation for the joy of Easter. It is my prayer that all of us here at St. Peter would join together during this special season as we repent of our sin and look for the death and resurrection of Christ.
