Church Is for Jesus

In the Church Year, we are currently in the time sometimes referred to as the "non-festival" portion of the year. Some people will speak of this time as the "long green season." Officially, it's the time of year when we count the Sundays after Pentecost.

This time has come to pick up the "non-festival" label because all of the major Church festivals are over. Christmas, Holy Week, Easter, Ascension, and Pentecost have all been celebrated and several months lie ahead until we will celebrate them again.

During these "non-festival" weeks, it's become a familiar sight in many churches to celebrate other kinds of festivals. Mother's Day, Father's Day, and 4th of July are some of the most widely celebrated, but there are others as well.

In fact, this trend has gone so far that people can easily fall into the trap of thinking the Church must celebrate these festivals as the highlight of that day. These Sundays, or the Sunday nearest these days, must be reserved for whatever the secular festival is and everything in the church service must revolve around it.

Now, while it is certainly good, right, and salutary, that we, as Christians, should celebrate days like these, we ought to do so with one thing in mind. Church is for Jesus.

Church is not for celebrating any festival that may appear on the secular calendar. Church is not for celebrating our independence from Great Britain. Church is not for recognizing and praising every vocation on its given week. Church is for Jesus.

This is not to say that we should ignore these festivals. On the contrary, actually. The Church should acknowledge these days, giving thanks to God for whatever it is we may be celebrating and praying to Him for the same. This can look like applauding for our veterans or recognizing our mothers and fathers or praying that God would continue to bless our nation.

But the service ought to remain focused on Jesus. After all, the Church is in, not of, of the world. That means that we come to worship as people who have these other festivals on our minds and hearts, but we do not let them overshadow the main reason we come: to receive the gifts of Christ and to rejoice and praise Him for them.

The devil is so eager for each and every one of us to make church about anything other than Jesus. Whether that's making the whole service about these worldly festivals or making it about our own preferences and feelings or anything else, Satan works tirelessly to try to make church about anything other than Jesus.

May it never be among us, according to God's great and abundant mercy. Because church is for Jesus. It's for Jesus to come to us and heal us in body and soul. It's for Jesus to forgive us our sins and give us everlasting life. It's for Jesus to comfort us and give us His resurrection joy. It's for Jesus to wash us clean in Holy Baptism, proclaim His life-giving Word to us, and to feed us with His very body and blood that is for us the very medicine of immortality.

Even though we may be in the "non-festival" season, when we remember that church is for Jesus, we realize that every Sunday is a festival. A mini-Easter, in fact, one of the most joyous festivals of the year.

So, let's not despise those other secular festivals, but let's celebrate them in their proper place. Because Church is for Jesus. Jesus, Who gives us those festivals to celebrate with one another. Who blesses them just as we ask Him to do in our prayers. And Who has an even greater thing for us to celebrate and focus on as He comes to us in His Word and Sacraments in His Church.

Distractions abound in our lives today. Even to the point of causing us to miss the blessings God has lavished on us in so many aspects of our lives.

Many families have been so distracted by the business of the world that they aren't willing to say no to things that keep them from hearing the Word of God, or receiving His gifts of forgiveness and life-sustaining body and blood.

Any one of us can dwell on the injustices of the world and forget that we are only called saints because of the actions of our Savior Jesus - not because we know the law so well.

Sometimes we might even let some of the good things distract us, sometimes even in church. Noisy and unruly children, neighbors boisterously greeting one another can distract us from God calling us to pray and care for those very people that might be deeply hurting inside while dealing with challenging children, or hurting because of loneliness, isolation or poor health that others aren't aware of. Sometimes the worship service itself can be a distraction for us- a hymn that we don't particularly care for, a sermon that just doesn't click with us or maybe hits too close to the heart, or sometimes the service just goes too long for our liking and in our distracted state of mind just didn't help us much.

It is important to be respectful to others and to have reverence of the worship service, some of us need some quiet preparation before worship, or have limited hearing and miss important parts of the service because of noisy children or people talking loudly - no, God's house isn't a playground.

We should do our best to help those families with troubles, praying for them, offering help where we can, or kind advice that we hopefully have learned from our own loving families who were patient with us at some points in our lives when we were less than manageable. We should remember that God saw us as redeemable just like everyone He has called to worship Him. We are blessed to have such a church that we have. We are blessed to have a God who saw fit to take us sinners and make us His saints through His Son's atoning sacrifice.

Hopefully we will all remember that the ultimate answer to distractions in our lives is knowing that God is in control. Participating in His blessings: worship, prayer, hearing His Word, and receiving the sacraments, loving God and loving our neighbor can be our diversion from distraction!

Missions: This year we will be supporting a variety of missions. Book of the Month: The Book of the Month will be available in the Parish Hall library for you to look through and read. The July Book of the Month is Lutheran Music and Meaning by Daniel Zagore. Here is an excerpt from the book: "Many Lutherans would find a spoken worship service – without any music at all – to be quite foreign to both past experience and current expectations. But the idea that music should somehow be related – perhaps even tightly related – to the spoken parts of the service, so that music contributes to an integrated whole, is not necessarily expected. I also want to explore that idea in this book. This book is not about how music might be meaningful to an individual on an emotional level, how music might relate to or affect an individual's feelings. Indeed, it would be impossible to account for the individual emotional responses of even a small group of people gathered for worship....While agreeing that meaning in Lutheran music is closely related to, even prompted by, verbal texts, I want to explore how the music itself plays a parallel role to text and can be studied objectively in terms of meaning."


