


We will celebrate Holy Communion during our worship service this evening.

Communion Statement - The Lord's Supper is celebrated at this congregation in the confession and glad confidence that, as He says, our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but His very body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with Him and with one another. Our Lord invites to His table those who trust His words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us, that they may show forth His death until He comes. Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive the Sacrament, are kindly asked first to speak with the pastor. In addition to this being our practice, we do not want our visitors to violate their own conscience or the public confession of faith that is made through their home Church membership. Those not receiving communion are invited to come forward with arms crossed to receive a blessing from the pastor. We thank you for respecting our practice. 


Apostles' Creed

Below you will find a model you can use for your personal or family devotions that focuses you on the readings from the previous Sunday, while also preparing you for what you will hear the following Sunday. In modeling your devotions this way, you and your family can stay united to the church year and reinforce what you hear, sing, and pray every Sunday.

Mon. 6/19: Read the Old Testament lesson: Exodus 19:2-8 – As God used Moses to speak His word to the people, so too does God continue to use men to speak His word to us, making us His holy people.

Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 834 – O God, O Lord of Heaven and Earth Pray the Collect of the Day: Almighty, eternal God, in the Word of Your apostles and prophets You have proclaimed to us Your saving will. Grant us faith to believe Your promises that we may receive eternal salvation; through Jesus Christ, our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

Tues. 6/20: Read the Epistle lesson: Romans 5:6-15 – Like Adam, we have all fallen into sin, but Christ took our sin upon Himself and died on the cross to redeem us. This salvation comes to us as a free gift, not as something we earn.

Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 834 – O God, O Lord of Heaven and Earth Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 6/19)

Wed. 6/21: Read the Gospel lesson: Matthew 9:35-10:8 (9-20) – Christ continues to send out laborers into the harvest, who bear His authority, to bring home His sheep who were lost in sin.

Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 834 – O God, O Lord of Heaven and Earth Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 6/19)

Thur. 6/22: Read the Old Testament lesson: Jeremiah 20:7-13 – As we cling to the Word of God, many will hate us and persecute us, but God will fight for us and vindicate us through Christ.

Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 659 – Lord of Our Life
Pray the Collect of the Day: O God, because Your abiding presence always goes with us, keep us aware of Your daily mercies that we may live secure and content in Your eternal love; through Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

Fri. 6/23: Read the Epistle lesson: Romans 6:12-23 – We are no longer slaves to sin, but alive to God for we have received the free gift of eternal life in Christ.

Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 659 – Lord of Our Life Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 6/22)

Sat. 6/24: Read the Gospel lesson: Matthew 10:5a, 21-33 – All who bear Christ's name will be hated by the world, even family and friends, but the ones who hate us can do nothing to harm our soul. Have no fear, then, for Christ brings you salvation.
