Increasing Our Fellowship

In 1 Corinthians 12, St. Paul describes the Church as a body. The body, he writes, is one and yet has many members. Not every part of the body is a hand or a foot or an eye, but all belong to the body just the same. Likewise, all are part of one, unified body, but each person is unique and has unique roles and vocations.

We see this quite beautifully in worship on Sunday mornings. Look around and you'll see people from all walks of life and with unique gifts and abilities and stories to tell. Yet, we are all there for one and the same reason: Jesus.

The sad reality, however, is that it's popular today to end things right there. To come to church on Sunday mornings and leave just as soon as possible, perhaps even without acknowledging a single other person on the way out.

Church has come to be treated like the timeclock at work. Punch in at the exact minute my shift starts, punch out as soon as the clock hits an hour, and go home because I've done the bare minimum to earn a paycheck.

May that not be among us! We are a body, and not just any body, but the body of Jesus Christ! A body lives together, works together, and breathes together. A body rejoices in the good times together and grieves in the bad times. A body comes to the aid of any part of it that's struggling or hurting. A body has fellowship between the different parts in a way unlike anything else in the world.

Consider then how we all might increase the fellowship within our own congregation. Sunday mornings are a great place to start. No greater fellowship is shared than sitting together to hear God's Word and receive His body and blood in the Lord's Supper.

But our fellowship need not stop there. Bible study following the service is a time of great fellowship. It's not just an academic exercise or an hour where the pastor drones on in a lecture. It's a time where questions are asked, struggles are shared together, good times are rejoiced over, and laughs echo every week. If you've never come to Bible study, come! Enjoy that time of fellowship with your fellow members.

Beyond worship and Bible study, fellowship happens at events like game nights, fish frys, council meetings, music group, and so on. Fellowship doesn't have to occur only as a part of a fundraiser or a religious activity. It can be as simple as people getting together and doing what they enjoy with their brothers and sisters in Christ.

To that end, if there's anything that can serve to increase our fellowship with one another, let's do it. Let's open the doors of the church or the parish hall and simply enjoy time together as the body of Christ.

For in the midst of fellowship like that, you'll get to learn more about one another. Divisions begin to break down, hard feelings melt away, disagreements become minor and trivial. Because as you enjoy fellowship with one another you learn more about that other member and their unique role in the body of Christ. You learn about the gifts God has given them and, most importantly, how that member desires nothing more than to believe in Jesus Christ and receive from Him forgiveness, life, and salvation.

It is my prayer that more fellowship like this can and will occur here in our midst. Because fellowship like this makes the body of the Church stronger. Because fellowship like this is good for all involved. And because fellowship like this leads us to be the light to the world that Jesus calls us to be. To Him alone be the glory forever and ever!


GENERAL INFORMATION

Missions: This year we will be supporting a variety of missions. The missions we will support include Clarity, Lakeview Ministries, Orphan Grain Train, Tiffany Smith (missionary for Lutheran Bible Translators serving in Tanzania), and a seminary student. If you would like to submit a name of a seminary student to receive this support, please speak to an elder or to Pastor. May God continue to bless these missions as Christ is proclaimed to the ends of the earth.

Puzzle Sharing: A puzzle share has recently started here at St. Peter. If you would like to borrow a puzzle or donate a puzzle, they can be found or placed in the cabinet in the Conference Room closest to the white board. Enjoy a variety of puzzles and some fellowship with your fellow brothers and sisters in Christ!

Thrivent Action Teams: If you have any Thrivent policies or products, you are eligible for two action teams a year. An action team includes \$250 seed money and may be used for a fundraiser, an educational event, or a service activity. As a church, we have used action teams for the fish fry, the youth golf scramble, Bible studies, etc. If you are interested in using your action teams for events at church or anywhere else, you can look for more information and help signing up on the Thrivent website or by speaking to Pastor.

Book of the Month: The Book of the Month will be available in the Parish Hall library for you to look through and read. You may take the book home to read as well, but we ask that you please do not hold onto it for too long so other people can enjoy it as well. The August Book of the Month is *Life in Christ: Rooted, Woven, and Grafted into God's Story* by Adam T. Filipek. Here is an excerpt from the book: "Isn't that all I need to know to be saved? While it is true that all people who confess with their mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in their heart that God raised Him from the dead will be saved (see Rm 10:9), it is also true that there are great dangers in asking a question like this. The first danger is that the tenor of the question treats the Word of God apathetically. Jesus, however, does not. He eagerly read from the scroll of the prophet Isaiah in the Nazareth synagogue (see Lk 4:17-21). He regularly references the beginning of creation, Adam, Abraham, Moses, David, Israel, and many other Old Testament people and events. He stressed the importance of hearing God's Word when He said, 'Whoever is of God hears the words of God' (Jn 8:47)."


