Communion Statement - The Lord's Supper is celebrated at this congregation in the confession and glad confidence that, as He says, our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but His very body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with Him and with one another. Our Lord invites to His table those who trust His words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us, that they may show forth His death until He comes. Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive the Sacrament, are kindly asked first to speak with the pastor. In addition to this being our practice, we do not want our visitors to violate their own conscience or the public confession of faith that is made through their home Church membership. Those not receiving communion are invited to come forward with arms crossed to receive a blessing from the pastor. We thank you for respecting our practice. Mon. 9/4:

Read the Old Testament lesson: Jeremiah 15:15-21 – The Lord will deliver us from evil and wickedness. When trouble and persecution come, we take joy and delight in Him and His Word.

Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 531 – Hail, Thou Once Despised Jesus Pray the Collect of the Day: Almighty God, Your Son willingly endured the agony and shame of the cross for our redemption. Grant us courage to take up our cross daily and follow Him wherever He leads; through the same Jesus Christ, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

Tues. 9/5: Read the Epistle lesson: Romans 12:9-21 – Vengeance is the Lord's. Live, then, in love toward your neighbor, repaying evil with good because your Lord Himself has overcome evil for you.

Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 531 – Hail, Thou Once Despised Jesus Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 9/4)

Wed. 9/6: Read the Gospel lesson: Matthew 16:21-28 – Just as Christ must suffer, die, and rise from the dead, so too will all who come after Christ suffer, die, and rise from the dead because of Him.

Sat. 9/9: Read the Gospel lesson: Matthew 18:1-20 – All sin cuts us off from God and leaves us lost. Christ, in His compassion, finds us and brings us to Himself. We, then, live in this forgiveness with one another knowing that Christ is with us.
