
We will celebrate Holy Communion during our worship service this evening.

Communion Statement - The Lord's Supper is celebrated at this congregation in the confession and glad confidence that, as He says, our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but His very body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with Him and with one another. Our Lord invites to His table those who trust His words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us, that they may show forth His death until He comes. Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive the Sacrament, are kindly asked first to speak with the pastor. In addition to this being our practice, we do not want our visitors to violate their own conscience or the public confession of faith that is made through their home Church membership. Those not receiving communion are invited to come forward with arms crossed to receive a blessing from the pastor. We thank you for respecting our practice. Mon. 9/18: Read the Old Testament lesson: Genesis 50:15-21 – We forgive because we know that in all things God provides for us and works all things for good.

Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 501 – Come Down, O Love Divine Pray the Collect of the Day: O God, our refuge and strength, the author of all godliness, hear the devout prayers of Your Church, especially in times of persecution, and grant that what we ask in faith we may obtain; through Jesus Christ, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

Tues. 9/19: Read the Epistle lesson: Romans 14:1-12 – Let us not pass judgment on our brothers and sisters in Christ, because we all belong to the Lord.

Sat. 9/23: Read the Gospel lesson: Matthew 20:1-16 – God's salvation is given to us completely as a gift. Our works do not earn salvation in any way. We labor, then, not for an increased wage, but at the direction of our Lord for the benefit of our neighbor.
