The Year Is the Lord's

As our calendars turn from 2023 to 2024, we are reminded that the earth isn't 2024 years old. Rather, it is 2024 years since our Lord's birth. We, rightfully, number our years around this most important event because the birth of Jesus is the turning point in history. It's the time when the Lord of all creation entered into His creation to save it from sin and death.

This turning point has long been marked by our use of the acronyms BC and AD. Technically speaking we are entering into the year 2024 AD. Most people have heard of these and use these terms, but often times they don't understand what they mean.

The meaning of BC is fairly well known as it stands for "Before Christ." By using this phrase, we are reminded that everyone who lived during those years was looking ahead to the coming of the Savior. Likewise, everything that happened during those years was preparing for the coming of Christ.

AD, on the other hand, is less well known. It's often said that this acronym stands for "After Death," as in after the death of Christ. That's not quite true, however. Instead, AD stands for the Latin phrase "Anno Domini," which translates to "in the Year of the Lord."

What a wonderful phrase this is! For this phrase reminds us that ever since the birth of Christ, we are now living in the year of our Lord. Or, to say it another way, after the birth of Christ, every year is the Lord's.

That's not to say that the BC years didn't belong to God, but it is to say that, in Christ, all time belongs to God. His birth, life, death, and resurrection redeemed everything. By His holy life and precious death, Jesus has subjected all things to Himself.

This is a blessed thing to keep in mind as a new year begins. Though the year ahead is filled with unknowns, though the year ahead will contain good times and bad, we know that the year is the Lord's. He will be with us every second of the year, guarding us and keeping us in Christ, our Savior.

Therefore, we have nothing to fear. 2024 AD will bring many new things into our lives and it will keep some things the same. Some of that will be good and some of that we may wish we could change. But through it all one thing won't change. Jesus Christ. He will remain our rock and our fortress, our Savior and our God.

May the Lord richly bless 2024 AD for us and for all people! For this year is the Lord's, as is every other year. And this year, He will be with us to bring us His forgiveness, life, and salvation through Christ, who suffered, died, and rose again for us. The year is the Lord's and so are we. Thanks and praise be to God!


GENERAL INFORMATION

Missions: This year we will be supporting a variety of missions. The missions we will support include Clarity, Lakeview Ministries, Orphan Grain Train, Tiffany Smith (missionary for Lutheran Bible Translators serving in Tanzania), and a seminary student. If you would like to submit a name of a seminary student to receive this support, please speak to an elder or to Pastor. May God continue to bless these missions as Christ is proclaimed to the ends of the earth.

Thrivent Action Teams: If you have any Thrivent policies or products, you are eligible for two action teams a year. An action team includes \$250 seed money and may be used for a fundraiser, an educational event, or a service activity. As a church, we have used action teams for the fish fry, the youth golf scramble, Bible studies, etc. If you are interested in


FROM THE OFFICE

Book of Concord Corner

"But deliver us from evil....

In the Greek text this petition reads, 'Deliver or preserve us from the evil one,' or 'the hateful one.' It looks like Jesus was speaking about the devil, like He would summarize every petition in one. So the entire substance of all our prayer is directed against our chief enemy. For it is he who hinders among us everything that we pray for: God's name or honor, God's kingdom and will, our daily bread, a cheerful good conscience, and so forth. Therefore, we finally sum it all up and say, 'Dear Father, grant that we be rid of all these disasters.' But there is also included in this petition whatever evil may happen to us under the devil's kingdom: poverty, shame, death, and, in short, all the agonizing misery and heartache of which there is such an unnumbered multitude on the earth. Since the devil is not only a liar, but also a murderer (John 8:44), he constantly seeks our life. He wreaks his vengeance whenever he can afflict our bodies with misfortune and harm. Therefore, it happens that he often breaks men's necks or drives them to insanity, drowns some, and moves many to commit suicide and to many other terrible disasters (e.g., Mark 9:17-22). So there is nothing for us to do upon earth but to pray against this archenemy without stopping. For unless God preserved us, we would not be safe from this enemy even for an hour." (Large Catechism, Part III, 113-116)

THE LUTHERAN CEMETERY ST. PETER LUTHERAN CHURCH WAYMANSVILLE, INDIANA

Dating from the rise and growth of St. Peter congregation, the Lutheran Cemetery originated and has been maintained out of a desire to provide a common burial place for the loved ones of our congregation. The cemetery and those whom it has served, have testified to a strong and mutual faith in Jesus Christ, the Resurrection, and the Life.

Any member of this congregation should feel free to address questions, suggestions and comments to the Church Board or its members at any time. The Board wishes to serve the best interests of the congregation and its members.

Burial space will be provided for:

- 1. Any baptized child and any communicant member of this congregation, grave lot cost-none.
- 2. Any spouse of the above, and who is not communicant member of this congregation, grave lot cost-2.5 times same as a similar lot (10 ft) at Garland Brook Cemetery.
- 3. Any non-member child under the age of 18, who is a child of a member of this congregation, and who is being ministered unto by this congregation, grave lot cost-none.
- 4. Any former baptized or communicant member of this congregation who is now a member of another Lutheran Church or another Christian Church, grave lot cost-2.5 times same as similar lot (10 ft.) at Garland Brook Cemetery.
- 5. Any non-member who is being ministered unto by this congregation; burials under this category must be approved by the Church Council, grave lot cost-2.5 times same as similar lot (10 ft) at Garland Brook Cemetery.
- 6. Any non-member who is be ministered unto by this congregation and who is taking instruction with the intent of becoming a member of this congregation, grave lot cost-none.

All burial fees are to be paid in advance. If for any reason the pastor of this congregation would refuse to take part in a burial service of someone eligible, who is eligible for burial in our cemetery, the burial may be performed by someone else. In such case, the pastor may suggest that a memorial service be conducted in the church following the burial.

Grave lot reservations may be made with the two cemetery superintendents, who shall be appointed by the Church Board. Grave lot reservations may be made when one of the immediate family dies or grave lot reservations may be made at any time, if if and when a tombstone is properly placed within twelve months and is in accordance with all other cemetery regulations and the approval of the cemetery superintendents and the Church Board. Grave lot fees are payable to St. Peter Lutheran Church. Such fees are handled by the General Fund Treasurer.

All grave lots are non-transferable. If one desires to relinquish his grave lot reservation, he must make written notification of such to the cemetery superintendents.

If a grave lot is abandoned, it becomes the property of the congregation. If the abandoned grave lot is purchased, there will be no reimbursement by the congregation. (Abandoned means: non-use of grave lot by the one who has it reserved.)

In our cemetery, the graves are dug in rotation. A row of graves begun will be finished before a new row is started. The graves in the various rows are to be equal in size, in order that the tombstones can be placed in a straight line. All graves shall be leveled to natural grade. All tombstones must have a standard foundation. Those desiring to place monuments must secure permission and instructions from the cemetery superintendents.

Currently the cemetery superintendents are Don Schafstall and Wayne Darlage.

The above cemetery policy shall be reviewed at least every five years by the Church Board.

This policy was adopted by the Voters' Assembly on April 9, 1972; and amended on October 8, 1972; April 13, 1975; and July 7, 1985.

Funeral Service Guidelines

The pastor should be contacted immediately upon the death of one for whom the family wishes the pastor to conduct the funeral service.

In such a case, no funeral arrangements should be made without the pastor's consent. The family is urged to include the pastor when speaking with the funeral director concerning the funeral arrangements.

The pastor makes the final decision as to which funerals he will conduct.

Financial payment for the pastor conducting the funeral service is not required; nor is financial payment required for the organist when the funeral service is conducted in our church.

Although funeral services under the auspices of the congregation may be conducted in the funeral home, it is recommended that such services be held in our church.

The family is encouraged to allow the casket to be closed before the service begins. It should then remain closed.

Funeral services should be such that they allow for congregational participation.

A reasonable amount of flowers may be brought to the church. Too many flowers only detract from the service.

It is wise to practice to offer financial memorials for causes other than flowers. The following is a partial list for such memorials:
