Valentine's Day: A Church Holiday!

February 14th every year, the world celebrates Valentine's Day. Stores are filled with heart-shaped boxes. Kids are busy writing Valentine's Day cards to their classmates. Couples make plans for a romantic evening with the one they love very much.

If you asked most people what Valentine's Day is, they'd mention all of that and probably not much else. If you asked them where it came from, they'd most likely say that it's another one of those "Hallmark holidays" invented to sell more cards, or something to that effect.

What most people don't realize is that Valentine's Day began as a Church holiday. February 14th is when the Church commemorates (that is, honors, celebrates, remembers) St. Valentine. Below is a writing concerning Valentine from William Weedon in his book *Celebrating the Saints: The Feasts, Festivals, and Commemorations of Lutheran Service Book* (pg. 38-39):

"The story of the man commemorated this day is in large part unknown. Some centuries after Valentine's death, Pope Gelasius would write that Valentine is among those 'whose names are justly reverenced among men, but whose acts are known only to God.' What is known is that Valentine ended life confessing Christ to the last, dying a martyr's death in Rome under Emperor Claudius II around AD 270.

Although we cannot know with any kind of certainty, later tradition suggested that he was both a doctor and priest. He was thus a man marked by his kindness and tender care of others in body and in soul. In this, he mirrored our Lord Jesus Christ, who healed the ailments of the body and yet more wondrously brought peace to the soul with His words of promise and hope.

The very day that Valentine was to face his martyrdom, he is said to have brought consolation to the daughter of his jailer by writing to her a small note of encouragement. The young girl had reportedly come to love this godly man and was grieved at the thought of his death. But Valentine knew that death was a defeated enemy because of Christ's death and resurrection. So he comforted the young lady. Hence, the custom of St. Valentine's day notes arose, which has spread far and wide.

From the relative obscurity of his life, we may learn a valuable lesson: God remembers what people forget. Baptized into Christ, marked with the holy cross as the Lord's own, fed with the body and blood of the Savior, Valentine lived and served, loved and died a witness to the invincible love of God in Christ Jesus. God remembers His saints across the ages, even the multitude of His own who never end up with a commemoration in the Church's calendar (other than All Saints' Day). Not one is forgotten. This will be apparent on the Last Day when Christ will call the dead to life and remember the deeds of all, crowning His grace in the lives of His own. Among the saints gathered before Him that day will be faithful Valentine, whose trust in Christ's promises was not in vain. For your holy martyr St. Valentine, all glory to You, Lord Jesus Christ!" As February 14th comes this year (and especially as it falls on Ash Wednesday), remember the reason for this

day. Yes, it's a great day to show love for your loved ones, to write them a card, or give them a gift. But even more so, it's a great day to give thanks to God for the witness of those, like Valentine, who have

come before us. It's a great day to gather with other beloved children of God to hear His Word and receive His Sacrament. It's a great day to come to church where God remembers you and comes to you with the great gifts of Christ.

A writing from 2 Peter 1:2-11:

^{"2} May grace and peace be multiplied to you in the knowledge of God and of Jesus our Lord. ³ His divine power has granted to us all things that pertain to life and godliness, through the knowledge of him who called us to his own glory and excellence, ⁴ by which he has granted to us his precious and very great promises, so that through them you may become partakers of the divine nature, having escaped from the corruption that is in the world because of sinful desire. ⁵ For this very reason, make every effort to supplement your faith with virtue, and virtue with knowledge, ⁶ and knowledge with self-control, and self-control with steadfastness, and steadfastness with godliness, ⁷ and godliness with brotherly affection, and brotherly affection with love. ⁸ For if these qualities are yours and are increasing, they keep you from being ineffective or unfruitful in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ. ⁹ For whoever lacks these qualities is so nearsighted that he is blind, having forgotten that he was cleansed from his former sins. ¹⁰ Therefore, brothers, be all the more diligent to confirm your calling and election, for if you practice these qualities you will never fall. ¹¹ For in this way there will be richly provided for you an entrance into the eternal kingdom of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ."





"Our churches teach that the history of the saints may be set before us so that we may follow the example of their faith and good works, according to our calling. For example, the emperor may follow the example of Davd (2 Samuel) in making war to drive away the Turk from his country. For both are kings. But the Scriptures do not teach that we are to call on the saints or to ask the saints for help. Scripture sets before us the one Christ as the Mediator, Atoning Sacrifice, High Priest, and Intercessor (1 Timothy 2:5-6). He is to be prayed to. He has promised that He will hear our prayer (John 14:13). This is the worship that He approves above all other worship, that He be called upon in all afflictions. 'If anyone does sin, we have an advocate with the Father' (1 John 2:1)." (Augsburg Confession, Article XXI, 1-4)


