


To listen via radio, please tune to AM 750.

Communion Statement - The Lord's Supper is celebrated at this congregation in the confession and glad confidence that, as He says, our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but His very body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with Him and with one another. Our Lord invites to His table those who trust His words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us, that they may show forth His death until He comes. Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive the Sacrament, are kindly asked first to speak with the pastor. In addition to this being our practice, we do not want our visitors to violate their own conscience or the public confession of faith that is made through their home Church membership. Those not receiving communion are invited to come forward with arms crossed to receive a blessing from the pastor. We thank you for respecting our practice. - Mon. 4/1: Read the Old Testament lesson: Isaiah 25:6-9 By the resurrection of Christ, God has swallowed up death forever and forgiven us all of our sins. We rejoice in this because it is our salvation.

- Fri. 4/5: Read the Epistle lesson: 1 John 1:1-2:2 Though we live in a world of darkness and still sin, Jesus advocates for us before the Father and brings us forgiveness through His blood and resurrection.

- Sat. 4/6: Read the Gospel lesson: John 20:19-31 The Scriptures are written so we may share in the faith of Thomas who confessed that Jesus is Lord and God. This faith is given to us through Christ's servants in the Office of the Holy Ministry who preach the Word and forgive our sins in the stead and by the command of Jesus.
