
We will celebrate Holy Communion during our worship service this evening.

Communion Statement - The Lord's Supper is celebrated at this congregation in the confession and glad confidence that, as He says, our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but His very body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with Him and with one another. Our Lord invites to His table those who trust His words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us, that they may show forth His death until He comes. Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive the Sacrament, are kindly asked first to speak with the pastor. In addition to this being our practice, we do not want our visitors to violate their own conscience or the public confession of faith that is made through their home Church membership. Those not receiving communion are invited to come forward with arms crossed to receive a blessing from the pastor. We thank you for respecting our practice. 
#### The Words of Our Lord




#### 428 Cross of Jesus, Cross of Sorrow







- Mon. 3/4: Read the Old Testament lesson: Exodus 20:1-17 The Ten Commandments reveal the Law of God, which shows us our sin and our need for a Savior who can fulfill that Law on our behalf.

  Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 824 May God Bestow on Us His Grace Pray the Collect of the Day: O God, whose glory it is always to have mercy, be gracious to all who have gone astray from Your ways and bring them again with penitent hearts and steadfast faith to embrace and hold fast the unchangeable truth of Your Word; through Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.
- Tues. 3/5: Read the Epistle lesson: 1 Corinthians 1:18-31 God shows His strength and wisdom through the cross which is strength and wisdom for us who believe.
