


We will celebrate Holy Communion during our worship service this evening.

Communion Statement - The Lord's Supper is celebrated at this congregation in the confession and glad confidence that, as He says, our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but His very body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with Him and with one another. Our Lord invites to His table those who trust His words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us, that they may show forth His death until He comes. Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive the Sacrament, are kindly asked first to speak with the pastor. In addition to this being our practice, we do not want our visitors to violate their own conscience or the public confession of faith that is made through their home Church membership. Those not receiving communion are invited to come forward with arms crossed to receive a blessing from the pastor. We thank you for respecting our practice. 
I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth and of all things visible and invisible.

In modeling your devotions this way, you and your family can stay united to the church year and reinforce what you hear, sing, and pray every Sunday.

- Mon. 3/11: Read the Old Testament lesson: Numbers 21:4-9 – God used the very thing that was afflicting His people to save His people. He used a serpent raised on a pole to save His people from the bite of serpents. Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 571 – God Loved the World So That He Gave Pray the Collect of the Day: Almighty God, our heavenly Father, Your mercies are new every morning; and though we deserve only punishment. You receive us as Your children and provide for all our needs of body and soul. Grant that we may heartily acknowledge Your merciful goodness, give thanks for all Your benefits, and serve You in willing obedience; through Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.
- Tues. 3/12: Read the Epistle lesson: Ephesians 2:1-10 – Though we were dead in our sins and trespasses, God makes us alive in Christ Jesus purely by His work and grace. Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 571 – God Loved the World So That He Gave Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 3/11)
- Wed. 3/13: Read the Gospel lesson: John 3:14-21 – Jesus was lifted up on the cross to suffer and die, so that by His death, we who believe in Him may not perish but have eternal life. By His death, He has saved us from death. Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 571 – God Loved the World So That He Gave Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 3/11)
- Read the Old Testament lesson: Jeremiah 31:31-34 The new covenant of the Lord Thur. 3/14: is one where we will know the Lord rightly as the One who forgive us our iniquities and remembers our sin no more. Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 430 – My Song Is Love Unknown Pray the Collect of the Day: Almighty God, by Your great goodness mercifully look upon Your people that we may be governed and preserved evermore in body and soul; through Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.
- Fri. 3/15: Read the Epistle lesson: Hebrews 5:1-10 – Christ Jesus is our High Priest who offered Himself as a sacrifice for us and continues to offer up prayers and supplications for us. Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 430 – My Song Is Love Unknown Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 3/14)
- Sat. 3/16: Read the Gospel lesson: Mark 10:(32-34) 35-45 – As Jesus came to serve by suffering and dying on the cross, so too are Christians called to serve even through suffering and death. Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 430 – My Song Is Love Unknown

Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 3/14)
