
We will celebrate Holy Communion during our worship service this evening.

<u>Communion Statement</u> - The Lord's Supper is celebrated at this congregation in the confession and glad confidence that, as He says, our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but His very body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with Him and with one another. Our Lord invites to His table those who trust His words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us, that they may show forth His death until He comes. Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive the Sacrament, are kindly asked first to speak with the pastor. In addition to this being our practice, we do not want our visitors to violate their own conscience or the public confession of faith that is made through their home Church membership. Those not receiving communion are invited to come forward with arms crossed to receive a blessing from the pastor. We thank you for respecting our practice. Below you will find a model you can use for your personal or family devotions that focuses you on the readings from the previous Sunday, while also preparing you for what you will hear the following Sunday. In modeling your devotions this way, you and your family can stay united to the church year and reinforce what you hear, sing, and pray every Sunday.

Read the Old Testament lesson: Ezekiel 37:1-14 – As the Word of God carried along Mon. 5/20: by the Holy Spirit caused the dry bones to rise to life again, so too does the Holy Spirit bring Christ to us so that we may rise to life again. Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 497 - Come, Holy Ghost, God and Lord Pray the Collect of the Day: O God, on this day You once taught the hearts of Your faithful people by sending them the light of Your Holy Spirit. Grant us in our day by the same Spirit to have a right understanding in all things and evermore to rejoice in His holy consolation, through Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen. Tues. 5/21: Read the Epistle lesson: Acts 2:1-21 – On the Day of Pentecost, the Lord poured out the Spirit so the proclamation of Christ may go out into all the world and everyone who hears Christ and calls on His name may be saved. Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 497 – Come, Holy Ghost, God and Lord Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 5/20) Wed. 5/22: Read the Gospel lesson: John 15:26-27; 16:4b-15 – The Holy Spirit comes to us to bear witness to Christ and the truth of His Word. This is always the work of the Spirit: to guide us to Christ. Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 497 - Come, Holy Ghost, God and Lord Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 5/20) Thur. 5/23: Read the Old Testament lesson: Isaiah 6:1-8 – The seraphim in heaven proclaim the truth and majesty of the Holy Trinity when they proclaim, "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts." Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 498 - Come, Holy Ghost, Creator Blest Pray the Collect of the Day: Almighty and everlasting God, You have given us grace to acknowledge the glory of the eternal Trinity by the confession of a true faith and to worship the Unity in the power of the Divine Majesty. Keep us steadfast in this faith and defend us from all adversities; for You, O Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, live and reign, one God, now and forever. Amen. Read the Epistle lesson: Acts 2:14a, 22-36 – Having received the Holy Spirit from Fri. 5/24: the Father, Peter confesses the death and resurrection of Jesus who is both Christ and Lord. Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 498 – Come, Holy Ghost, Creator Blest Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 5/22) Sat. 5/25: Read the Gospel lesson: John 3:1-17 – We enter the kingdom of God through Holy Baptism, where the name of the Triune God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, is place upon us as we are born from above of water and the Spirit. Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 498 – Come, Holy Ghost, Creator Blest Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 5/23)
