Communion Statement - The Lord’s Supper is celebrated at this congregation in the confession and glad confidence that, as He says, our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but His very body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with Him and with one another. Our Lord invites to His table those who trust His words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us, that they may show forth His death until He comes. Because those who eat and drink our Lord’s body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive the Sacrament, are kindly asked first to speak with the pastor. In addition to this being our practice, we do not want our visitors to violate their own conscience or the public confession of faith that is made through their home Church membership. Those not receiving communion are invited to come forward with arms crossed to receive a blessing from the pastor. We thank you for respecting our practice. - Mon. 4/7:

Read the Old Testament lesson: Isaiah 43:16-21 – The Lord is doing a new thing by giving His people life out of death.

Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 430 – My Song Is Love Unknown

Pray the Collect of the Day: Almighty God, by Your great goodness mercifully look upon Your people that we may be governed and preserved evermore in body and soul; through Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.
- Tues. 4/8:

Read the Epistle lesson: Philippians 3:(4b-7) 8-14 – Everything is worthless compared to having Christ. Press on towards this goal, because in Christ you have everything you could ever need, even the resurrection of your body.

Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 430 – My Song Is Love Unknown

Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 4/4)
- Wed. 4/9:

Read the Gospel lesson: Luke 20:9-20 – Christ is rejected even by His own people so that He may become our cornerstone who gives us God’s kingdom.

Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 430 – My Song Is Love Unknown

Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 4/4)
- Thur. 4/10:

Read the Old Testament lesson: Deuteronomy 32:36-39 – The Lord, who is the only God, will vindicate us, His people, by giving us life that not even death can take away from us.

Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 438 – A Lamb Goes Uncomplaining Forth

Pray the Collect of the Day: Almighty and everlasting God, You sent Your Son, our Savior Jesus Christ, to take upon Himself our flesh and to suffer death upon the cross. Mercifully grant that we may follow the example of His great humility and patience and be made partakers of His resurrection; through the same Jesus Christ, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.
- Fri. 4/11:

Read the Epistle lesson: Philippians 2:5-11 – Through the humiliation of His death on the cross, Christ is exalted because He defeats death there and brings us salvation and life.

Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 438 – A Lamb Goes Uncomplaining Forth

Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 4/7)
- Sat. 4/12:

Read the Gospel lesson: John 12:12-19 & Luke 23:1-56 – Hosanna to the King of Israel who comes to save us through His suffering and death!

Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 438 – A Lamb Goes Uncomplaining Forth
