Communion Statement - The Lord's Supper is celebrated at this congregation in the confession and glad confidence that, as He says, our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but His very body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with Him and with one another. Our Lord invites to His table those who trust His words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us, that they may show forth His death until He comes. Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive the Sacrament, are kindly asked first to speak with the pastor. In addition to this being our practice, we do not want our visitors to violate their own conscience or the public confession of faith that is made through their home Church membership. Those not receiving communion are invited to come forward with arms crossed to receive a blessing from the pastor. We thank you for respecting our practice. Below you will find a model you can use for your personal or family devotions that focuses you on the readings from the previous Sunday, while also preparing you for what you will hear the following Sunday. In modeling your devotions this way, you and your family can stay united to the church year and reinforce what you hear, sing, and pray every Sunday.

- Mon. 6/23: Read the Old Testament lesson: Isaiah 65:1-9 – Though Israel, and the world, is full of sinners who despise God, He will not destroy everyone, but rather will bring forth offspring through Judah, the tribe of Jesus.
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 825 – Rise, Shine, You People
Pray the Collect of the Day: O God, You have prepared for those who love You such good things as surpass our understanding. Cast out all sins and evil desires from us, and pour into our hearts Your Holy Spirit to guide us into all blessedness; through Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.
- Tues. 6/24: Read the Epistle lesson: Galatians 3:23-4:7 – We are sons of God through faith. In Baptism, we have put on Christ.
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 825 – Rise, Shine, You People
Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 6/23)
- Wed. 6/25: Read the Gospel lesson: Luke 8:26-39 – Jesus drowned the demons from the man in water and saved him. Because of this, he sat at the feet of Jesus, His Savior.
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 825 – Rise, Shine, You People
Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 6/23)
- Thur. 6/26: Read the Old Testament lesson: 1 Kings 19:9b-21 – The Lord called Elijah and Elisha to do His work in Israel.
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 688 – “Come, Follow Me,” the Savior Spake
Pray the Collect of the Day: Lord of all power and might, author and giver of all good things, graft into our hearts the love of Your name and nourish us with all goodness that we may love and serve our neighbor; through Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.
- Fri. 6/27: Read the Epistle lesson: Galatians 5:1, 13-25 – We are free in Christ, though, through the help of the Holy Spirit, we use our freedom to love our neighbor by serving him.

Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 6/26)
- Sat. 6/28: Read the Gospel lesson: Luke 9:51-62 – Jesus calls disciples to follow Him, preaching the Gospel without looking back at the things of this world.
