Communion Statement - The Lord's Supper is celebrated at this congregation in the confession and glad confidence that, as He says, our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but His very body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with Him and with one another. Our Lord invites to His table those who trust His words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us, that they may show forth His death until He comes. Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive the Sacrament, are kindly asked first to speak with the pastor. In addition to this being our practice, we do not want our visitors to violate their own conscience or the public confession of faith that is made through their home Church membership. Those not receiving communion are invited to come forward with arms crossed to receive a blessing from the pastor. We thank you for respecting our practice. 
Below you will find a model you can use for your personal or family devotions that focuses you on the readings from the previous Sunday, while also preparing you for what you will hear the following Sunday. In modeling your devotions this way, you and your family can stay united to the church year and reinforce what you hear, sing, and pray every Sunday.

- Mon. 7/7: Read the Old Testament lesson: Isaiah 66:10-14 – God extends peace to His Church, satisfying her and bringing her comfort. For this, the Church rejoices.
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 533 – Jesus Has Come and Brings Pleasure
Pray the Collect of the Day: Almighty God, You have built Your Church on the foundation of the apostles and prophets with Christ Jesus Himself as the cornerstone. Continue to send Your messengers to preserve Your people in true peace that, by the preaching of Your Word, Your Church may be kept free from all harm and danger; through Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.
- Tues. 7/8: Read the Epistle lesson: Galatians 6:1-10, 14-18 – We boast in nothing except the cross of our Lord. Since Christ has died for us and gives us everything we could ever need, we can bear one another's burdens and share all good things within the Church.
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 533 – Jesus Has Come and Brings Pleasure
Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 7/7)
- Wed. 7/9: Read the Gospel lesson: Luke 10:1-20 – God sends out men to proclaim peace to the world through Jesus Christ. Those who hear these men hear Christ. Those who reject them reject Christ.
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 533 – Jesus Has Come and Brings Pleasure
Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 7/7)
- Thur. 7/10: Read the Old Testament lesson: Leviticus (18:1-5) 19:9-18 – With the help of God, we follow His rules, keep His statutes, and walk in them by loving God and loving our neighbor as ourselves.
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 845 – Where Charity and Love Prevail
Pray the Collect of the Day: Lord Jesus Christ, in Your deep compassion You rescue us from whatever may hurt us. Teach us to love You above all things and to love our neighbors as ourselves; for You live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.
- Fri. 7/11: Read the Epistle lesson: Colossians 1:1-14 – The Gospel has come to us and bears its fruit among us as God delivers us out of darkness and into His kingdom.
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 845 – Where Charity and Love Prevail
Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 7/10)
- Sat. 7/12: Read the Gospel lesson: Luke 10:25-37 – Christ is the One who shows mercy to us by forgiving us our sins and binding up our wounds in the resurrection. Let us show mercy to others, just as we have first received it from Christ.
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 845 – Where Charity and Love Prevail
Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 7/10)
