Communion Statement - The Lord’s Supper is celebrated at this congregation in the confession and glad confidence that, as He says, our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but His very body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with Him and with one another. Our Lord invites to His table those who trust His words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us, that they may show forth His death until He comes. Because those who eat and drink our Lord’s body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive the Sacrament, are kindly asked first to speak with the pastor. In addition to this being our practice, we do not want our visitors to violate their own conscience or the public confession of faith that is made through their home Church membership. Those not receiving communion are invited to come forward with arms crossed to receive a blessing from the pastor. We thank you for respecting our practice. 

Below you will find a model you can use for your personal or family devotions that focuses you on the readings from the previous Sunday, while also preparing you for what you will hear the following Sunday. In modeling your devotions this way, you and your family can stay united to the church year and reinforce what you hear, sing, and pray every Sunday.

- Mon. 10/6: Read the Old Testament lesson: Habakkuk 1:1-4; 2:1-4 – Do not fear when you see evil and wrong in the world, for the Lord will act at His appointed time and Christ will surely come again. Live by this faith.
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 587 – I Know My Faith Is Founded
Pray the Collect of the Day: O God, our refuge and strength, the author of all godliness, by Your grace hear the prayers of Your Church. Grant that those things which we ask in faith we may receive through Your bountiful mercy; through Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.
- Tues. 10/7: Read the Epistle lesson: 2 Timothy 1:1-14 – Guard the good deposit of the faith which God has created in you and do not be ashamed of it no matter what the world does to you.
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 587 – I Know My Faith Is Founded
Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 10/6)
- Wed. 10/8: Read the Gospel lesson: Luke 17:1-10 – We, unworthy servants as we are on account of sin, deserve nothing, but Christ forgives us, gives us faith, and invites us to recline at table, eating and drinking, as He serves us.
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 587 – I Know My Faith Is Founded
Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 10/6)
- Thur. 10/9: Read the Old Testament lesson: Ruth 1:1-19 – In the midst of death and suffering, we cling to the one true God, looking to Him for life and salvation.
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 846 – Your Hand, O Lord, in Days of Old
Pray the Collect of the Day: Almighty God, You show mercy to Your people in all their troubles. Grant us always to recognize Your goodness, give thanks for Your compassion, and praise Your holy name; through Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.
- Fri. 10/10: Read the Epistle lesson: 2 Timothy 2:1-13 – As the elect of God, we cling to His Word through which we obtain the salvation Christ won for us by His death and resurrection.
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 846 – Your Hand, O Lord, in Days of Old
Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 10/9)
- Sat. 10/11: Read the Gospel lesson: Luke 17:11-19 – Your faith, which is a gift from God, has cleansed you from your sin because it continuously cries out to Christ, “Jesus, Master, have mercy on us.”
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 846 – Your Hand, O Lord, in Days of Old
Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 10/9)
