Communion Statement - The Lord's Supper is celebrated at this congregation in the confession and glad confidence that, as He says, our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but His very body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with Him and with one another. Our Lord invites to His table those who trust His words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us, that they may show forth His death until He comes. Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive the Sacrament, are kindly asked first to speak with the pastor. In addition to this being our practice, we do not want our visitors to violate their own conscience or the public confession of faith that is made through their home Church membership. Those not receiving communion are invited to come forward with arms crossed to receive a blessing from the pastor. We thank you for respecting our practice. For further study, see Matt. 5:23f.; 10:32f.; 18:15-35; 26:26-29; 1 Cor. 11:17-34.


Below you will find a model you can use for your personal or family devotions that focuses you on the readings from the previous Sunday, while also preparing you for what you will hear the following Sunday. In modeling your devotions this way, you and your family can stay united to the church year and reinforce what you hear, sing, and pray every Sunday.

- Mon. 10/27: Read the first lesson: Revelation 14:6-7 – The eternal Gospel of Christ’s death and resurrection is proclaimed to all people.
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 656 – A Mighty Fortress Is Our God
Pray the Collect of the Day: Almighty and gracious Lord, pour out Your Holy Spirit on Your faithful people. Keep us steadfast in Your grace and truth, protect and deliver us in times of temptation, defend us against all enemies, and grant to Your Church Your saving peace; through Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.
- Tues. 10/28: Read the Epistle lesson: Romans 3:19-28 – Righteousness comes, not as a result of our works, but as a result of faith, which is purely a gift from God.
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 656 – A Mighty Fortress Is Our God
Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 10/27)
- Wed. 10/29: Read the Gospel lesson: John 8:31-36 – We were all born as slaves to sin, but Christ, the Son of God, sets us free to be sons of God. Now we abide in His Word and His truth forever and we are free indeed.
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 656 – A Mighty Fortress Is Our God
Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 10/27)
- Thur. 10/30: Read the first lesson: Revelation 7:(2-8) 9-17 – We join with the complete multitude of the saints praising the Lamb, by whose blood we are cleansed, and giving Him thanks for this salvation.
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 677 – For All the Saints
Pray the Collect of the Day: Almighty and everlasting God, You knit together Your faithful people of all times and places into one holy communion, the mystical body of Your Son, Jesus Christ. Grant us so to follow Your blessed saints in all virtuous and godly living that, together with them, we may come to the unspeakable joys You have prepared for those who love You; through Jesus Christ, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.
- Fri. 10/31: Read the Epistle lesson: 1 John 3:1-3 – We are the children of God and, though it is hidden to our eyes now, He will purify us by the blood of Christ, making us to be like Him in His glory.
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 677 – For All the Saints
Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 10/30)
- Sat. 11/1: Read the Gospel lesson: Matthew 5:1-12 – Blessed is Christ, who is the fulfillment of the Beatitudes, and blessed are we who are joined into Christ.
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 677 – For All the Saints
Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 10/30)
