Communion Statement - The Lord's Supper is celebrated at this congregation in the confession and glad confidence that, as He says, our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but His very body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with Him and with one another. Our Lord invites to His table those who trust His words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us, that they may show forth His death until He comes. Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive the Sacrament, are kindly asked first to speak with the pastor. In addition to this being our practice, we do not want our visitors to violate their own conscience or the public confession of faith that is made through their home Church membership. Those not receiving communion are invited to come forward with arms crossed to receive a blessing from the pastor. We thank you for respecting our practice. - Mon. 11/10: Read the Old Testament lesson: Exodus 3:1-15 – The name of God, I AM WHO I AM, reminds us that God is always with us, no matter what suffering we endure.  
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 713 – From God Can Nothing Move Me  
Pray the Collect of the Day: Living God, Your almighty power is made known chiefly in showing mercy and pity. Grant us the fullness of Your grace to lay hold of Your promises and live forever in Your presence; through Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.
- Tues. 11/11: Read the Epistle lesson: 2 Thessalonians 2:1-8, 13-17 – Stand firm! For not even the man of lawlessness can take your salvation away.  
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 713 – From God Can Nothing Move Me  
Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 11/10)
- Wed. 11/12: Read the Gospel lesson: Luke 20:27-40 – The name of God testifies to the truth of the resurrection. All the sons of God will rise from death, never to die again.  
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 713 – From God Can Nothing Move Me  
Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 11/10)
- Thur. 11/13: Read the Old Testament lesson: Malachi 4:1-6 – The Day of the Lord will bring judgment for the unbeliever, but healing for the believer.  
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 508 – The Day Is Surely Drawing Near  
Pray the Collect of the Day: O Lord, almighty and ever-living God, You have given exceedingly great and precious promises to those who trust in You. Rule and govern our hearts and minds by Your Holy Spirit that we may live and abide forever in Your Son, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.
- Fri. 11/14: Read the Epistle lesson: 2 Thessalonians 3:1-13 – As you live in your various vocations, imitate the saints who did not grow weary in doing good.  
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 508 – The Day Is Surely Drawing Near  
Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 11/13)
- Sat. 11/15: Read the Gospel lesson: Luke 21:5-36 – Death and destruction, pain and suffering will continue until the day Christ returns, but stay awake for He will return with power and great glory to bring your redemption in the resurrection.
