Communion Statement - The Lord's Supper is celebrated at this congregation in the confession and glad confidence that, as He says, our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but His very body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with Him and with one another. Our Lord invites to His table those who trust His words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us, that they may show forth His death until He comes. Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive the Sacrament, are kindly asked first to speak with the pastor. In addition to this being our practice, we do not want our visitors to violate their own conscience or the public confession of faith that is made through their home Church membership. Those not receiving communion are invited to come forward with arms crossed to receive a blessing from the pastor. We thank you for respecting our practice. Below you will find a model you can use for your personal or family devotions that focuses you on the readings from the previous Sunday, while also preparing you for what you will hear the following Sunday. In modeling your devotions this way, you and your family can stay united to the church year and reinforce what you hear, sing, and pray every Sunday.

- Mon. 11/24: Read the Old Testament lesson: Malachi 3:13-18 – The Lord forgives us, even though we have spoken against Him, and through this forgiveness makes us into His treasured possession.  
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 534 – Lord, Enthroned in Heavenly Splendor  
Pray the Collect of the Day: Lord Jesus Christ, You reign among us by the preaching of Your cross. Forgive Your people their offenses that we, being governed by Your bountiful goodness, may enter at last into Your eternal paradise; for You live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.
- Tues. 11/25: Read the Epistle lesson: Colossians 1:13-20 – In Christ, by Whom all things were made and Whose blood makes peace, all things in creation are held together.  
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 534 – Lord, Enthroned in Heavenly Splendor  
Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 11/24)
- Wed. 11/26: Read the Gospel lesson: Luke 23:27-43 – While the sinful world brings insults, pain, and death, the King of kings opens the door to paradise through His death on the cross.  
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 534 – Lord, Enthroned in Heavenly Splendor  
Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 11/24)
- Thur. 11/27: Read the Old Testament lesson: Isaiah 2:1-5 – People from all nations shall come to the mountain of the Lord to learn from Him and walk in His peace.  
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 332 – Savior of the Nations, Come  
Pray the Collect of the Day: Stir up Your power, O Lord, and come, that by Your protection we may be rescued from the threatening perils of our sins and saved by Your mighty deliverance; for You live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.
- Fri. 11/28: Read the Epistle lesson: Romans 13:8-14 – Put on Jesus Christ, Who is Love, and cast off the works of darkness for salvation draws nearer every day.  
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 332 – Savior of the Nations, Come  
Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 11/27)
- Sat. 11/29: Read the Gospel lesson: Matthew 21:1-11 – The Son of David comes to this earth in order to go to the cross to reign as our King. Hosanna in the highest!
