Communion Statement - The Lord's Supper is celebrated at this congregation in the confession and glad confidence that, as He says, our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but His very body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with Him and with one another. Our Lord invites to His table those who trust His words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us, that they may show forth His death until He comes. Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive the Sacrament, are kindly asked first to speak with the pastor. In addition to this being our practice, we do not want our visitors to violate their own conscience or the public confession of faith that is made through their home Church membership. Those not receiving communion are invited to come forward with arms crossed to receive a blessing from the pastor. We thank you for respecting our practice. Below you will find a model you can use for your personal or family devotions that focuses you on the readings from the previous Sunday, while also preparing you for what you will hear the following Sunday. In modeling your devotions this way, you and your family can stay united to the church year and reinforce what you hear, sing, and pray every Sunday.

Mon. 4/6: Read the Old Testament lesson: Jeremiah 31:1-6 – God loves us, His people, with an everlasting love and faithfulness and invites us to go up to His Church to receive His gifts from His hands.  
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 458 – Christ Jesus Lay in Death’s Strong Bands  
Pray the Collect of the Day: Almighty God the Father, through Your only-begotten Son, Jesus Christ, You have overcome death and opened the gate of everlasting life to us. Grant that we, who celebrate with joy the day of our Lord’s resurrection, may be raised from the death of sin by Your life-giving Spirit; through Jesus Christ, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

Tues. 4/7: Read the Epistle lesson: Colossians 3:1-4 – We are raised with Christ so our life is hidden in and with Him even as He sits in glory at the right hand of the Father.  
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 458 – Christ Jesus Lay in Death’s Strong Bands  
Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 4/6)

Wed. 4/8: Read the Gospel lesson: Matthew 28:1-10 – Our fear of sin and death is taken away with the great news that Christ has burst the bars of sin, death, and the grave and that He is not dead, but living!  
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 458 – Christ Jesus Lay in Death’s Strong Bands  
Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 4/6)

Thur. 4/9: Read the first lesson: Acts 5:29-42 – The world can do nothing to stop the resurrection from being proclaimed. Not even persecution and suffering will stop the teaching and preaching that Jesus is the Christ.  
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 470 – O Sons and Daughters of the King  
Pray the Collect of the Day: Almighty God, grant that we who have celebrated the Lord’s resurrection may by Your grace confess in our life and conversation that Jesus is Lord and God; through the same Jesus Christ, Your Son, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

Fri. 4/10: Read the Epistle lesson: 1 Peter 1:3-9 – We rejoice in the resurrection of Jesus because by it we have the imperishable inheritance of our own resurrection which is more precious than anything else in the world.  
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 470 – O Sons and Daughters of the King  
Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 4/9)

Sat. 4/11: Read the Gospel lesson: John 20:19-31 – The Scriptures are written so we may share in the faith of Thomas who confessed that Jesus is Lord and God. This faith is given to us through Christ’s servants in the Office of the Holy Ministry who preach the Word and forgive our sins in the stead and by the command of Jesus.  
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 470 – O Sons and Daughters of the King  
Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 4/9)
