Below you will find a model you can use for your personal or family devotions that focuses you on the readings from the previous Sunday, while also preparing you for what you will hear the following Sunday. In modeling your devotions this way, you and your family can stay united to the church year and reinforce what you hear, sing, and pray every Sunday.

- Mon. 4/13: Read the first lesson: Acts 5:29-42 – The world can do nothing to stop the message of the resurrection from being proclaimed. Not even persecution and suffering will stop the teaching and preaching that Jesus is the Christ.  
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 470 – O Sons and Daughters of the King  
Pray the Collect of the Day: Almighty God, grant that we who have celebrated the Lord’s resurrection may by Your grace confess in our life and conversation that Jesus is Lord and God; through the same Jesus Christ, Your Son, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.
- Tues. 4/14: Read the Epistle lesson: 1 Peter 1:3-9 – We rejoice in the resurrection of Jesus because by it we have the imperishable inheritance of our own resurrection which is more precious than anything else in the world.  
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 470 – O Sons and Daughters of the King  
Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 4/13)
- Wed. 4/15: Read the Gospel lesson: John 20:19-31 – The Scriptures are written so we may share in the faith of Thomas who confessed that Jesus is Lord and God. This faith is given to us through Christ’s servants in the Office of the Holy Ministry who preach the Word and forgive our sins in the stead and by the command of Jesus.  
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 470 – O Sons and Daughters of the King  
Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 4/13)
- Thur. 4/16: Read the first lesson: Acts 2:14a, 36-41 – When we are cut to the heart, repent and run back to your baptism where the promise of Christ and His forgiveness is given to you.  
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 483 – With High Delight Let Us Unite  
Pray the Collect of the Day: O God, through the humiliation of Your Son You raised up the fallen world. Grant to Your faithful people, rescued from the peril of everlasting death, perpetual gladness and eternal joys; through Jesus Christ, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.
- Fri. 4/17: Read the Epistle lesson: 1 Peter 1:17-25 – Since you are ransomed free by the blood of the Lamb, Jesus Christ, love one another and live as one born through the imperishable and resurrected Word of God.  
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 483 – With High Delight Let Us Unite  
Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 4/16)
- Sat. 4/18: Read the Gospel lesson: Luke 24:13-35 – All of the Scriptures bear witness to the death and resurrection of Jesus. Our eyes are open to this through the Word and through the breaking of the bread, which is the Lord’s Supper.  
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 483 – With High Delight Let Us Unite  
Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 4/16)
