Communion Statement - The Lord’s Supper is celebrated at this congregation in the confession and glad confidence that, as He says, our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but His very body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with Him and with one another. Our Lord invites to His table those who trust His words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us, that they may show forth His death until He comes. Because those who eat and drink our Lord’s body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive the Sacrament, are kindly asked first to speak with the pastor. In addition to this being our practice, we do not want our visitors to violate their own conscience or the public confession of faith that is made through their home Church membership. Those not receiving communion are invited to come forward with arms crossed to receive a blessing from the pastor. We thank you for respecting our practice. 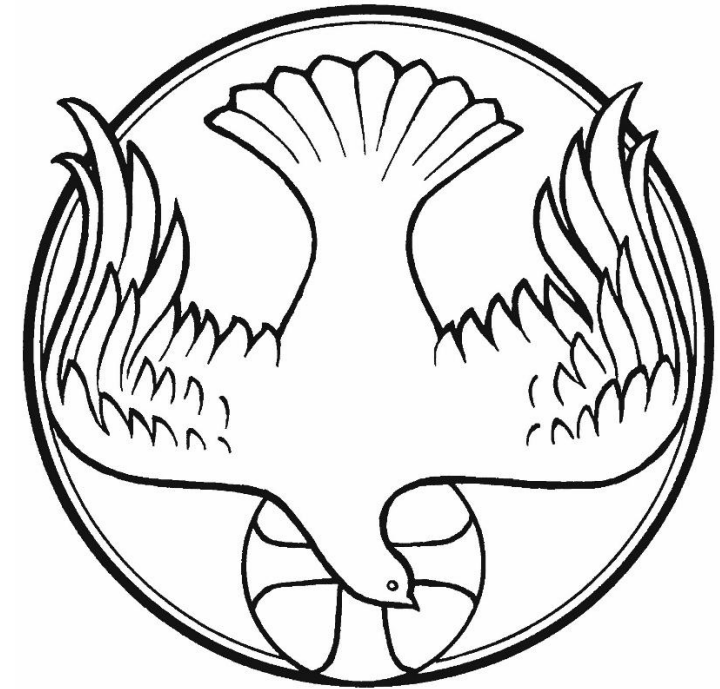

Below you will find a model you can use for your personal or family devotions that focuses you on the readings from the previous Sunday, while also preparing you for what you will hear the following Sunday. In modeling your devotions this way, you and your family can stay united to the church year and reinforce what you hear, sing, and pray every Sunday.

- Mon. 5/11: Read the first lesson: Acts 17:16-31 – God is made known to us in the person of Jesus Christ and we are assured of this by His resurrection from the dead.
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 556 – Dear Christians, One and All, Rejoice
Pray the Collect of the Day: O God, the giver of all that is good, by Your holy inspiration grant that we may think those things that are right and by Your merciful guiding accomplish them; through Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.
- Tues. 5/12: Read the Epistle lesson: 1 Peter 3:13-22 – Continue to bear witness to Christ no matter what suffering may come, for Christ has suffered to save you and He gives this salvation to you in Holy Baptism.
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 556 – Dear Christians, One and All, Rejoice
Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 5/11)
- Wed. 5/13: Read the Gospel lesson: John 14:15-21 – Christ sends the Holy Spirit to be with His children. The Holy Spirit dwells in the believers and places Christ always before their eyes.
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 556 – Dear Christians, One and All, Rejoice
Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 5/11)
- Thur. 5/14: Read the first lesson: Acts 1:12-26 – The Lord chose Matthias to be numbered among the Apostles as a witness to the resurrection of Christ.
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 539 – Christ Is the World’s Redeemer
Pray the Collect of the Day: O King of glory, Lord of hosts, uplifted in triumph far above all heavens, leave us not without consolation but send us the Spirit of truth whom You promised from the Father; for You live and reign with Him and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.
- Fri. 5/15: Read the Epistle lesson: 1 Peter 4:12-19; 5:6-11 – Resist the devil and stand firm in the faith for if you suffer for the sake of Christ, you are blessed. In fact, rejoice that you are counted worthy to share in suffering for the sake of Christ.
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 539 – Christ Is the World’s Redeemer
Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 5/14)
- Sat. 5/16: Read the Gospel lesson: John 17:1-11 – Even as Christ prepares to ascend back to the Father, He prays for us because we are His and He gives us eternal life.
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 539 – Christ Is the World’s Redeemer
Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 5/14)
