Communion Statement - The Lord’s Supper is celebrated at this congregation in the confession and glad confidence that, as He says, our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but His very body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with Him and with one another. Our Lord invites to His table those who trust His words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us, that they may show forth His death until He comes. Because those who eat and drink our Lord’s body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive the Sacrament, are kindly asked first to speak with the pastor. In addition to this being our practice, we do not want our visitors to violate their own conscience or the public confession of faith that is made through their home Church membership. Those not receiving communion are invited to come forward with arms crossed to receive a blessing from the pastor. We thank you for respecting our practice. 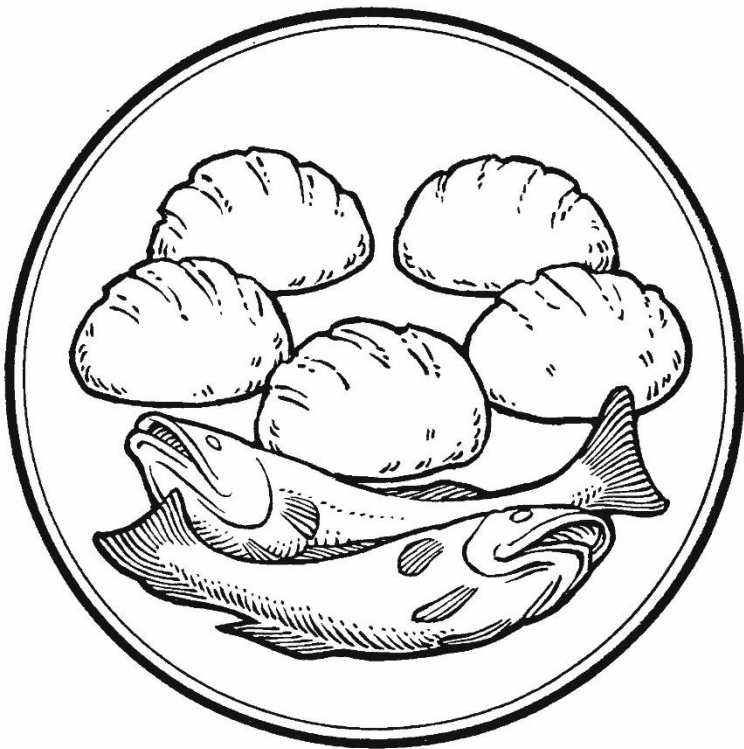

Below you will find a model you can use for your personal or family devotions that focuses you on the readings from the previous Sunday, while also preparing you for what you will hear the following Sunday. In modeling your devotions this way, you and your family can stay united to the church year and reinforce what you hear, sing, and pray every Sunday.

- Mon. 8/3: Read the Old Testament lesson: Isaiah 55:1-5 – Come, eat and drink the Lord’s free bread and wine by which He gives you His steadfast love and glorifies you.
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 642 – O Living Bread from Heaven
Pray the Collect of the Day: Heavenly Father, though we do not deserve Your goodness, still You provide for all our needs of body and soul. Grant us Your Holy Spirit that we may acknowledge Your gifts, give thanks for all Your benefits, and serve You in willing obedience; through Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.
- Tues. 8/4: Read the Epistle lesson: Romans 9:1-5 (6-13) – Christ descends from the nation of Israel, though it is not by the flesh that we receive Him, but by His promise.
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 642 – O Living Bread from Heaven
Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 8/3)
- Wed. 8/5: Read the Gospel lesson: Matthew 14:13-21 – Christ has compassion on us and heals us by feeding us with the bread which is His body.
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 642 – O Living Bread from Heaven
Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 8/3)
- Thur. 8/6: Read the Old Testament lesson: Job 38:4-18 – It is God who has created all things and He alone has dominion over them all. Do not fear, therefore, because all things are subject to God.
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 717 – Eternal Father, Strong to Save
Pray the Collect of the Day: Almighty and most merciful God, preserve us from all harm and danger that we, being ready in both body and soul, may cheerfully accomplish what You want done; through Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.
- Fri. 8/7: Read the Epistle lesson: Romans 10:5-17 – Hearing the word of Christ, faith is created in us which confesses Jesus as Lord and causes our heart to believe that God raised Him from the dead.
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 717 – Eternal Father, Strong to Save
Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 8/6)
- Sat. 8/8: Read the Gospel lesson: Matthew 14:22-33 – As Jesus treads treacherous waters under His feet, He takes away our fear by saving us from certain death.
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 717 – Eternal Father, Strong to Save
Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 8/6)
